#### RECITAL

Whereas: Davangere University, Davangere (herein after referred to as "DU") is one of the India leading academic University committed to teaching, and research,

Whereas: DU has ample of experience, resources and infrastructures in Material Synthesis, Nano Science & Technology, application of nano materials in various fields, Natural Product/Medicinal Chemistry, evaluation of medicinal plants for their efficacy, safety and quality with in vitro and in vivo methods of various Bioassay methods,







Whereas: The Adama Science and Technology University (ASTU) (herein after referred to as "ASTU"), is committed to the development of human resource capacity by providing wide range academic training in Science and Technology including inorganic, organic, synthetic and natural products and laboratory training and other subject matter specialists,

Whereas: Both parties wish to form an alliance to promote the development of highly qualified professionals and conduct research together by the synergy of a collaborative and sharing approach,

Whereas: it is necessary to establish formal procedures defining the party's roles and responsibilities in term of such alliance,

Now therefore, the parties agree as follows,

#### CLAUSES

#### FIRST

The present agreement has been designed to facilitate university cooperation in both academic and research fields, during the higher education.

#### SECOND

In order to carry out this cooperative programme, both parties agree to:

- Communicate the results of their pedagogical experiences (courses, seminars, etc.).
- Inform the partner institution about any congresses, debates, science meetings and seminars
  organized by each university, and exchange those documents and publications resulting
  from their activities.
- Promote, according to each country's regulations, instructors' participation in courses, conferences, seminars and congresses organized by the partner institution, as stated in the yearly cooperative programmes.
- Promote, according to their possibilities, staff exchanges for a specified period of time, being academic or research activities their main objectives. Exchanges shall be subject to the policies of the university involved.
- Accept students from the sister institution provided they meet the requirements in force
  established by the host institution and under suitably established conditions. As regards
  medical insurance, the students shall be under the rules in force drawn up by the receiving
  institution.





- Both the concrete cooperation programs and the actions for students Exchange will require
  the signature of a specific agreement that will include, at least, the number of students to be
  exchanged, the duration, the degrees offered, and any information that should be taken under
  consideration. The mentioned specific agreements will be added as an appendix to this
  framework agreement.
- Identification of joint research areas and training.
- Provide hands on training on Nano Science & Technology, Organic synthesis and synthesis and isolation of bioactive compounds related laboratory training for PhD students and academic staff of ASTU.
- · Collaborate in mentoring/advising PhD and MSc students of ASTU
- Arranging host laboratory for PhD/MSc students and academic staff based on separate agreement between the two institutions
- · Delivering PhD courses and laboratory training at ASTU campus up on invitation
- Joint project proposal development and grant application
- Recruits instructors and mentors for the trainings and mentorships mostly those who are subject matter expert from DU.
- Facilitate host for professors who will be involved in the training and research as per the University rules and regulation.
- · Recruit Instructors and Mentors from both Universities as guest staff
- · Provide all the necessary to the guest staff
- In collaboration with the DU, identifies and invites international and national experts for the teaching
- In collaboration with the DU, ensures and is involved in the recruitment and screening of candidates for the training.
- Ensures the conduct of training based on the agreed upon competency domains stipulated in the training curriculum;
- Sets requirements for graduation of PhD and MSc students involved in joint project

#### THIRD

The specific cooperative programmes shall be drawn up annually and appended to this agreement.





#### FOURTH

Each institution shall endeavour to reserve in their budgets the necessary funds for the application of the agreement and to obtain the complementary financial help or subsidies.

#### FIFTH

Each institution will appoint a representative in order to define and organise the cooperation programmes between both institutions.

Dr. Tegene Desalegn (Dean, SoANS) and Dr. H.C. Ananda Murthy (Applied Chemistry Program, SoANS) from Adama Science and Technology University (Ethiopia) side and Prof. Gayathri Devaraja, Registrar, Director, IQAC and Dr. Nagaswarupa II P (Department of Studies in Chemistry) from Davangere University, Davangere side will be in charge of drawing up the annual work calendar and deal with unsettled questions. They shall meet alternatively at both institutions unless otherwise stated.

#### SIXTH

The present agreement shall be passed by each institution's relevant Bodies and signed by their respective Vice Chancellors, Rectors or Presidents and shall enter into force on the date of the final signature hereto.

The duration of this agreement is four (4) years, unless denounced by three (3) month prior written notice and without affecting the completion of any activity underway at the time.

The duration of the agreement can be extended by equal periods at the initiative of any of the parties, prior written agreement, before the date of its conclusion.

#### SEVENTH

Any modification to this agreement, by common consent with both institutions, shall require the same proceedings as for its initial drawing up.

#### EIGHTH

A Joint Committee for Supervision and Control is created, formed by those responsible for it mentioned in Clause Five. This committee shall be in charge of the resolution of problems that may arise regarding its interpretation and enforcement.

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

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#### MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

This Memorandum of Understanding is made and entered into at Bangalore on 19th day of February ("Effective Date"), 2021.

Between

Swami Vivekananda Yoga Anusandhana Samsthana (S-VYASA), Bangalore

And

Davangere University, Shivagangothri, Davangere (DUD)

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Standory Alert.

Swami Vivekananda Yoga Anusandhana Samsthana (S-VYASA), a registered society devoted to yoga research and applications recognised as a Deemed to be University by the UGC based in Bangalore at # 19, Eknath Bhavan, Gavipuram Circle, KG Nagar, Bangalore 560019, and its International Head Quarters at Prashanti Kutiram (20 miles from Bangalore), India hereinafter; referred to as S-VYASA and Davangere University, Shivagangothri (DUD), Davangere, a University as recognized by MHRD/UGC, Govt. of India, and for the purpose of this MoU represented by the Department of Studies in Yogic Sciences, Davangere University, Shivagangothri (DUD), Davanagere, Karnataka, India (hereinafter referred to as "DUD"), as one part

#### Section 1 Recitals

Section 1.1 On Swami Vivekananda Yoga Anusandhana Samsthana (S-VYASA)

- 1.1.1. Whereas S-VYASA has done extensive scientific research in Yoga and applications over the last 18 years, standardized the modules of yoga suited for various applications of Yoga such as Yoga for Health including mental health, Yoga in education, yoga for stress management, etc.;
- 1.1.2. Whereas S-VYASA has been recognized as a Deemed to be University by the government of India, Ministry of HRD through UGC, New Delhi, India.
- 1.1.3. Whereas S-VYASA has been receiving grants from the Ministry of Health, Dept of ISM &H, Govt. of India, Central Council of Yoga & Naturopathy (CCRYN), New Delhi, Indian Council of Medical Research New Delhi, Defense Research Development Organisation, Department of Science & Technology, New Delhi etc for conducting research projects;

Section 1.2 on Davangere University, Davangere

1.2.1. Whereas the Davangere University was established (with a Gazette Notification from the Government of Karnataka) on 18th August 2009 by being carved out of Kuvempu University with a purpose and vision to meet the educational aspirations of the people of this region. The university has 124 Colleges affiliated to it in total, with one Constituent College and one Autonomous College, offering Graduate and Post-Graduate programmes in various disciplines catering to the educational needs of more than 60,000 students.





1.2.2. Department of Studies in yogic Science, Davangere University: Yoga one of the most important subjects of study in our ancient school of learning yoga focus on developing integration between thoughts words and deeds of an individual that in turn helps in establishing harmony between self and surroundings. In present day life which is associated with full of stress and strain causing a number of psychometric disorders. Yogic science occupies a special significance. The world communities are looking towards India for an application of yoga and yogic practice for holistic health of mankind. Several hundred traditionally trained teachers serve the population around the world, unfortunately among them many are not so well trained through improper methods have brought disrepute to this ancient science. At this juncture, there is an urgent need to evolve good yoga teachers, providing yoga therapy and conduct research to develop yogic science. Realigning this fact Davangere University has started the Yogic Science department in the year 2018 as Two years M Sc program along with one year diploma course and certificate course have also been started. This program includes well designed syllabus and students can learn all the aspects of yoga according to tradition and plenty of opportunities are there after completing this course. Now a day's government has been planning to appoint yoga teachers in all schools and colleges in addition vast job offers from abroad.

#### Section 2 the Understanding

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- 2.1. S-VYASA agrees to offer in providing services, training in yoga leading to Certificate and Diploma courses and Yoga related research dimensions at "Department of Studies in yogic Science".
- 2.2. S-VYASA agrees to send personnel for Conducting Yoga classes at "Department of Studies in Yogic Science" (both short term and long-term yoga courses) and yoga therapy modules for outpatients and in- patients at the premises designated by "Department of Studies in yogic Science".
- 2.3. S-VYASA and "Department of Studies in yogic Science "agree to initiate collaborative research projects/ short term course including Certificate and Diploma courses in Integrative Medicine on yoga and its applications related to Medical and Health Sciences (MHS), Physical Education, Sports Sciences, Sports Medicine and other life style diseases. Financial arrangements for such collaborations shall be decided by both parties on project to project basis through separate agreements.

- 2.4. S-VYASA and "Department of Studies in Yogic Science" agree to exchange students and faculty for purposes of training, research and services in yoga and its applications in Medical and Health Sciences (MHS), Physical Education, Sports science and sports medicine and other Medical & Health Science departments.
- 2.5. S-VYASA and " Department of Studies in Yogic Science " agree to provide their infrastructures and personnel to have joint efforts to conduct seminars, workshops, symposia and conferences related to yoga and clinical disciplines at " Department of Studies in yogic Science "

#### Section 3. Intellectual Property

- 3.1. S-VYASA agrees to share, with "DoS in Yogic Science " its Research labs and research team to conduct research projects related to Yoga and its applications at S-VYASA campus as well as at "DoS in Yogic Science". For each such research project the parties shall agree in writing as to the scope, place and personnel required, together with the costs, contribution of each, the rights and duties of each party and sharing formula of Intellectual Property Rights, if any prior to starting any such research projects.
- 3.2.1f funding for a research project is provided in whole or in part by "DoS in Yogic Science " or the resources required for a research project are contributed in whole or in part by the two institutions under an agreement of doing a joint research project or as otherwise agreed between SVYASA and "DoS in Yogic Science " then, in each such case, the project and its outcomes shall be jointly owned by both S-VYASA and "DoS in yogic Science ". For each jointly owned project, both parties shall receive equal credits and shall equally share the revenues, if any, related to or arising out of any such research outcomes. Neither party shall license, share, transfer or give to any other party, person or organization, any portion or all of the research or any other Intellectual Property related to or arising out of or connected with any such research project, without the prior written consent of the other, nor shall either party have the right to use any portion of such research in other projects, ventures or collaborations without the prior written consent of the other.
- 3.3. S-VYASA agrees that "DoS in Yogic Science, DU" shall have the first right of refusal with respect to any new research project contemplated by S-VYASA which is not a part of or related to any other collaborations or writings by which S-VYASA is bound, as of the date of signing of this Agreement. "DoS in Yogic Science, DU" shall provide its

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written agreement or refusal to S-VYASA, as the case may be, within 30 days of receiving a complete proposal for any research from SVYASA. Upon the receipt of "DoS in Yogic Science, DU" written refusal S-VYASA shall be free to collaborate with any other entity of its choice, subject otherwise to the terms of this MoU.

- 3.4. S-VYASA and "DoS in Yogic Science, DU " shall co-operate further to provide for the protection of intellectual property created under this Agreement or related thereto, within 90 days of the signing of this Agreement. The provisions of this section shall be an independent covenant and shall survive the termination or expiration of this MoU for any reason whatsoever.
- 3.5. Except as specifically provided in this MoU, each party shall be free to pursue its business and research and shall be the sole owner or co-owner with its collaborators, of any such research, its outcome and findings.

#### Section 4. Mutual Covenants

- 4.1. The two institutions agree to exchange faculty and personnel, subject to the financial terms agreed between the parties in writing, for mutual benefit and for conducting programs in accordance with the terms of this Agreement. Upon agreement any financial terms between the parties shall be effective when committed to writing, signed by both parties. Any such agreement shall automatically become a part of this MoU.
- 4.2. S-VYASA and "DoS in Yogic Science, DU " agree that the parties will work diligently to establish a system whereby students admitted at either campus shall be allowed to take a part of or the whole of the program for which such student has registered at the other campus. Details of the logistics of such an arrangement and the financial arrangements shall be worked between the parties. Any such arrangement shall be effective when committed in writing signed by both parties. Once finalized in writing signed by both parties, such writing shall automatically become a part of this Agreement.
- 4.3. The parties agree to co-operate so as to give meaning to the words and spirit of this MOU. The terms of each project undertaken by S-VYASA and "DOS in YS, DU" shall be specified in particular for each such project prior to initiation of any such project. This MOU shall serve as the basic guidelines to be followed by the parties in all their collaborations.

4.4 Each institution will appoint a representative in order to define and organise the cooperation programmes between both institutions.

Dr. Vijaya Majumdar from S-VYASA side and Prof. Gayathri Devaraja, Director, IQAC, Professor in Department of Studies in Microbiology and Coordinator Department of Studies in Yogic Sceince and Dr. Nagaswarupa H P (Department of Studies in Chemistry), NAAC Coordinator from Davangere University, Davangere side will be in charge of drawing up the annual work calendar and deal with unsettled questions. They shall meet alternatively at both institutions unless otherwise stated.

#### Section 5. Duration of the Memorandum of Understanding:

This Memorandum of Understanding has come into effect from the date of signing for a duration of FIVE years (60 months). Thereafter it will be reviewed and may be renewed as agreed by both parties. Amendments to the Memorandum of Understanding can take place at any time by an exchange of letters mutually agreed upon.

#### Section 6. Publication

Publications, if any, in respect of the activity under this MoU shall be in the names of involved personnel from both the parties. In all publications (papers, reports, etc.,) it will be duly acknowledged that the work has been carried out by DOS in YS, DU and S-VYASA under this MoU between the parties.

#### Section 7. Termination

Not withstanding clause 2.5, this MoU may be terminated by either party by giving 60 days notice in writing to the other party. Either of the parties shall honor within a mutually agreed period, the outstanding commitments, if any, as on the date of termination.

#### Section 8. Jurisdiction clause

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In case of any conflict of interest or litigation, disputes arising between the parties, the same shall be resolved by way of arbitration as per the Arbitration and Conciliation Act. However, the courts at Bengaluru shall have the original jurisdictional area to entertain any suit or proceedings only in respect to any claims arising there from.

#### Davanagere University:

Davanagere University is one of the youngest affiliating types of Universities in Karnataka. It has a jurisdiction of two Districts viz., Davangere and Chitradurga and headquartered at Davangere. Davangere which was part of Chitradurga District became a separate district on 15th August 1997 and is emerging as an important educational centre besides being a well-known commercial and industrial town in Karnataka. # East West Institute of Technology:

East West Institute of Technology, who are having strong R&D facilities as well as good infrastructure and human resources. It imparts courses in the engineering branches of Mechanical Engg., Computer Science and Engineering, Electronics and Communication Engineering, Information Science and Engineering, Civil Engineering, Electronics and Electrical Engg for UG and PG programmes. East West Institute of Technology is also well equipped with laboratories in Chemistry, Physics, Environmental Engineering, Materials testing, Geology, Geo Technical Engineering, Energy Engineering, Structural Engineering. Electronics & Computer Systems etc. and all are university approved and recognized labs.

The Research centres in East West Institute of Technology have been established with a mission of exploring scientific research in the field of upcoming Science and Technology. At present the centers are developing semiconductor nano-materials for application in environmental cleaning. They shall meet alternatively at both institutions unless otherwise stated.
- For the purpose of this MOU, East West Institute of Technology, Bengaluru to
  provide the technical assistance in matters relating to research on need basis as
  mutually agreed upon.
- Davangere University and East West Institute of Technology may in joint collaboration organize conduct workshops, training programmes, research activities, and assist in further development of research ecosystem in the Davangere University.
- If need arises, Davangere University and East West Institute of Technology they may
  constitute a working group to work out the practical problems of collaboration if any,
  between the two parties in general and to ensure proper and effective implementation
  of this MOU.
- Such details agreed upon will be effective by exchange of letters by Davangere University, East West Institute of Technology and such letters shall form part of this agreement.

### SCOPE OF THE MOU:

Davangere University and East West Institute of Technology shall/may take relevant steps and measures to protect, promote and enhance research and development, which shall create scope for development of research and take appropriate decisions and measure in furtherance of the same.

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

Davangere University established in 2009 by bifurcating two districts from Kuvempu University, Shivamogga, for catering to the needs of higher education for the people of Davangere and Chitradurga districts, where 112 affiliated UG/PG colleges are functioning with an intake 50,000+ students. #### Points of agreement:

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- 11. The Knowledge imparting team is expected to conduct a session either visit or virtual at least once in every 30 days during active semester months. However plan of visit can be rescheduled as per the convenience of the KIT (Knowledge Imparting Team) and of the students' community.
- The students of social work can approach the KIT for seeking assistance in getting accommodated for Regular Field Work and also for Block Placement.
- The KIT will assist Davangere University's MSW Department in attracting companies and industries for campus placement events at Davanagere University campus, if possible.
- The KIT shall assist the Students of Social Work to make orientation visits and exposure learnings.
- 15. Collection of additional fee for conducting capacity building workshops through IFHA is subject to final decision of the Chairman, Social Work Department, in consent with the Registrar, Davangere University.
- 16. IFHA shall assist the Department of Social Work in organizing Study tours in and around Karnataka State by coordinating with needful organizations through getting permission for orientation visits during Study tour programme,
- 17. Cooperation from IFHA is also sought by the Department of Social Work, Davangere University, in connection with conducting National and International events at Davangere University such as Seminars and Conferences.

#### Meeting and reporting:

The nominated team of representatives of the Memorandum of understanding along with respective Memorandum of understanding Monitoring Officers (MUMO) of the agreed Universities shall meet once in every six months to examine the progress of the MOU objectives.

The committee shall also examine the activities taking place under this agreement, evaluate the exist process, procedure and the provisions for making use of MOU benefits and also shall recommend for any modifications required in exist objectives for the betterment of the beneficiary class of both the Institutions.

Davangere University shall issue a certificate, duly signed by the Registrar (Administrative head of the University), to the knowledge contributing institution every time for being serving the University by imparting various required skills and knowledge to its students' community.

Davangere University shall provide a lodging facility to the resource persons deputed by Innovative Forum of HR Associates, Karnataka Chapter, Mysore, in its campus at Davangere or Chitradurga. (In case if programmes are held at P G Centre, Chitradurga)

Entire logistics materials, Auditorium, Audio-visual aids, etc., required for any of the event organized shall be provided by Davangere University.

Davangere University's Permissible Travelling allowance and dearness allowance along with approved structure of remuneration shall be given to the resource persons deputed by Innovative Forum of HR Associates, Karnataka Chapter, Mysore. All transactions shall be taken place via RTGS operated through State Bank of India, Davangere University campus branch, Davanagere.

#### Appointment of Monitoring Officer and Departmental Committee:

Both the Institutions shall, as soon as possible, appoint a "Nodal Officer", to monitor all the activities that take place under Memorandum of understanding.

Chairman, Department of Social Work, Davanagere University and General Secretary of IFHA shall be the Nodal officers for monitoring the activities of MOU related activities at their respective institutional level.

#### STATE

That drawn by the willingness to reinforce the existing academic relationships and establish new ones, and with the necessary mutual legal capacity to sign the present agreement on behalf of the institution that they represent, agree

#### RECITAL.

Whereas: Davangere University, Davangere(herein after referred to as "DU") is one of the India leading academic University committed to teaching, and research,

Whereas: DU has ample of experience, resources and infrastructures in Material Synthesis, Nano Science & Technology, application of nano materials in various fields, Natural Product/Medicinal Chemistry, evaluation of medicinal plants for their efficacy, safety and quality with *in vitro* and *in vivo* methods of various Bioassay methods, try to give few more in management and other subjects

Whereas: Srinivas University (SU) (herein after referred to as "SU"), is committed to the development of human resource capacity by providing wide range academic training in Nanotechnology education in Engineering, Aerospace Technology, Research on Marine Engineering, Environmental Engineering, Management subject and Materials Science

Whereas: Both parties wishes to form an alliance to promote the development of highly qualified professionals and conduct research together by the synergy of a collaborative and sharing approach,

Whereas: it is necessary to establish formal procedures defining the party's roles and responsibilities in term of such alliance,

Now therefore, the parties agree as follows,

#### CLAUSES

#### FIRST

The present agreement has been designed to facilitate university cooperation in both academic and research fields, during the higher education.



#### SECOND

In order to carry out this cooperative programme, both parties agree to:

- Communicate the results of their pedagogical experiences (courses, seminars, etc.).
- Inform the partner institution about any congresses, debates, science meetings and seminars
  organized by each university, and exchange those documents and publications resulting
  from their activities.
- Promote, according to each country's regulations, lecturers' participation in courses, conferences, seminars and congresses organized by the partner institution, as stated in the yearly cooperative programmes.
- Promote, according to their possibilities, lecturers' exchanges for a specified period of time, being academic or research activities their main objectives. Exchanges shall be subject to the policies of the departments involved.
- Accept students from the sister institution provided they meet the requirements in force
  established by the host institution and under suitably established conditions. As regards
  medical insurance, the students shall be under the rules in force drawn up by the receiving
  institution.
- Both the concrete cooperation programs and the actions for students Exchange will require
  the signature of a specific agreement that will include, at least, the number of students to be
  exchanged, the duration, the degrees offered, and any information that should be taken
  under consideration. The mentioned specific agreements will be added as an appendix to
  this framework agreement.
- · Identification of joint research areas and training.
- Provide hands on training on Nano Science & Technology, Organic synthesis and synthesis
  and isolation of bioactive compounds related laboratory training for PhD students and
  academic staff of SU.
- Collaborate in mentoring/advising PhD students of SU
- Arranging host laboratory for PhD students and academic staff sponsored by SU
- Joint project proposal development and grant application
- Recruits instructors and mentors for the trainings and mentorships mostly those who are subject matter expert from DU.
- Facilitate host for professors who will be involved in the training and research as per the University rules and regulation.
- Recruit Instructors and Mentors from DU as guest staff to SU.
- Provide all the necessary to the guest staff

- Ensures the conduct of training based on the agreed upon competency domains stipulated in the training curriculum;
- Sets requirements for graduation of PhD students involved in joint project

#### THIRD

The specific cooperative programmes shall be drawn up annually and appended to this agreement.

#### FOURTH

Each institution shall endeavour to reserve in their budgets the necessary funds for the application of the agreement and to obtain the complementary financial help or subsidies.

#### FIFTH

Each institution will appoint a representative in order to define and organise the cooperation programmes between both institutions.

Dr. Praveen B M (Director - Research) from Srinivas University side and Prof. Gayathri Devaraja, Director, IQAC and Dr. Nagaswarupa H P (Department of Studies in Chemistry) from Davangere University, Davangere side will be in charge of drawing up the annual work calendar and deal with unsettled questions. They shall meet alternatively at both institutions unless otherwise stated.

#### SIXTH

The present agreement shall be passed by each institution's relevant Bodies and signed by their respective Vice Chancellors, Rectors or Chancellors and shall enter into on the date of the final signature hereto.

The duration of this agreement is four (4) years, unless denounced by three (3) month prior written notice and without affecting the completion of any activity underway at the time.

The duration of the agreement can be extended by equal periods at the initiative of any of the parties, prior written agreement, before the date of its conclusion.

#### SEVENTH

Any modification to this agreement, by common consent with both institutions, shall require the same proceedings as for its initial drawing up.

#### EIGHTH

A Joint Committee for Supervision and Control is created, formed by those responsible for it mentioned in Clause Five. This committee shall be in charge of the resolution of problems that may arise regarding its interpretation and enforcement.

#### NINE

- Both parties shall allocate fund in kind and/or cash for the implementation as per the agreed up on plan of action jointly,
- The specific and other contribution responsibilities of the parties shall be dealt in detail on the implementation schedule.
- Procurement procedures shall be performed according to the rules and regulations of respective institutions.
- Only expenditures that have acceptable receipts and having supporting documents will be settled.

#### TEN

- The MOU shall be subject to periodic review and amendment. Any amendment of the MOU will get acceptance if all the signatories agree on it.
- This memorandum of understanding shall be effective from the date of its signature and shall continue to be so for successive four years unless terminated by one of the parties by giving notice of at least 3 months.

(First Party and Second Party are hereinafter jointly referred to as 'Parties' and individually as 'Party') as

#### WHEREAS:

A) First Party is a Higher Educational Institution named:

#### (i) DAYANGERE UNIVERSITY

- B) First Party & Second Party believe that collaboration and co-operation between themselves will promote more effective use of each of their resources, and provide each of them with enhanced opportunities.
- C) The Parties intent to cooperate and focus their efforts on cooperation within area of Skill Based Training, Education and Research.
- Both Parties, being legal entities in themselves desire to sign this MOU for advancing their mutual interests.
- E) Eaglesford Media the Second Party is engaged in Business, Manufacturing, Skill Development, Education and R&D Services in the fields of Skill development, outcome based trainings, placements and R&D Services and relatedfields

- F) Eaglesford Media , the Second Party is promoted by Eaglesford group of companies and F-94, Tarangini Apartment, Galli No-2 , Mahavir Enclave , South West Delhi , New Delhi -110045

# NOW THEREFORE, IN CONSIDERATION OF THE MUTUAL PROMISES SET FORTH IN THIS MOU, THE PARTIES HERE TO AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

#### CLAUSE 1

#### CO-OPERATION

- 1.1 Both Parties are united by common interests and objectives, and they shall establish channels of communication and co-operation that will promote and advance their respective operations within the Davangere University and its related wings. The Parties shall keep each other informed of potential opportunities and shall share all information that may be relevant to secure additional opportunities for one another.

The term of Definitive Documents shall be mutually decided between the Parties. - 2.4 Research and Development: Both Parties have agreed to carry out the joint research activities in the fields of Digital media, Data journalism, Television media.
- 2.5 Skill Development Programs: Second Party to train the students of First Party on the emerging technologies in order to bridge the skill gap and make them industry ready.
- 2.6 Guest Lectures: Second Party to extend the necessary support to deliver guest lectures to the students of the First Party on the technology trends and in house requirements.
- 2.7 Faculty Development Programs: Second Party to train the Faculties of First Party for imparting training as per the industrial requirement considering the National Occupational Standards in concerned sector, if available.
- 2.8 Placement of Trained Students: Second Party will actively engage to help the delivery of the training and placement of students of the First Party into internships/jobs; and will facilitate placements for at least 30% of the students. The Second Party will itself absorb at least 20 percentage of the trained students.
- 2.9 Both Parties to obtain all internal approvals, consents, permissions, and licenses of whatsoever nature required for offering the Programmes on the terms specified herein
- 2.10 There is no financial commitment on the part of the **DAVANGERE UNIVERSITY**, the First Party to take up any programme mentioned in the MoU. If there is any financial consideration, it will be dealt separately.

### CLAUSE 3 INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY

3.1 Nothing contained in this MOU shall, by express grant, implication, Estoppel or otherwisecreate in either Party any right, title, interest, or license in or to the intellectual property (including but not limited to know-how, inventions, patents, copy rights and designs) of the other Party.

### **CLAUSE 4**

#### VALIDITY

- 4.1 This Agreement will be valid until it is expressly terminated by either Party on mutually agreed terms, during which period Davangere University, the Second Party, as the case may be, will take effective steps for implementation of this MOU. Any act on the part of Eaglesford Media, the Second Party after termination of this Agreement by way of communication, correspondence etc., shall not be construed as an extension of this MOU

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Davangere University is one of the youngest Universities in Karnataka. It has a jurisdiction of two Districts viz., Davangere and Chitradurga and headquartered at Davangere. Davangere which was part of Chitradurga District became a separate district on 15<sup>th</sup>August 1997 and is emerging as an important educational centre besides being a well known commercial and industrial town in Karnataka. Davangere University prior to its establishment functioned as a Post-Graduate Centre of the University of Mysore from 1979 to 1987. Later, with the establishment of Kuvempu University in 1987, the P.G. Center came under the jurisdiction of the new University due to its geographical location and hence functioned as its P.G. Centre from 1987 to 2009.

Davangere University was established (with a Gazette Notification from the Government of Karnataka) on 18th August 2009 after being carved out of Kuvempu University with a purpose and vision to meet the educational aspirations of the people of this region. The University has 112 Colleges affiliated to it in total, with one Constituent College and one Autonomous College, offering Graduate and Post-Graduate programmes in various disciplines catering to the educational needs of more than 60,000 students. Karnataka State Council for Science and Technology (KSCST) was established in the year 1975. It is one of the first State S&T Councils set up in the country. KSCST is an autonomous S&T organization under Department of Science & Technology, Government of Karnataka.

During the last 45 years, KSCST has been pro-actively engaging itself to identify, propose and implement S&T based solutions to locale specific needs/problems in the broad areas of Water, Education, Energy, Ecology and Environment, Waste management and Infrastructure. In co-operation with the Indian Institute of Science and several other premier R&D institutions, KSCST executes many projects and programmes aimed at improving socio-economic conditions of the people of the state.



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
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Over the years, a number of technologies have been generated, from research and demonstration phase, to the implementation and operational phase. 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

- Shall make available suitable infrastructure, place, manpower for functioning of IP cell and also other needful amenities for the same.
- Should allow IP cell to sensitize and involve the students, faculties research scholars, and other members and provide awareness and training workshops on IPR periodically.
- May allow the IP Cell to identify and drive the innovation to file & commercialize the IPRs from the institutions associated with host institute.
- Should also allocate or source fund from other agencies for filing, commercialising, Technology transfer and any IPR issues of the host institute

### DURATION OF THE MOU

This MoU shall be in effect initially for a period of (Five years) from the date on which this MoU is signed by both the parties and may be renewed thereafter, by mutual consent. Either party may terminate the agreement by written notification sent to the proper Officer of the institution. Such notice must be received by either Party within six months prior of the effective termination date.

That drawn by the willingness to reinforce the existing academic relationships and establish new ones, and with the necessary mutual legal capacity to sign the present agreement on behalf of the institution that they represent, agree

### RECITAL

Whereas: Davangere University, Davangere (herein after referred to as "DU") is one of the India's leading academic Universities committed to teaching, research and extension, o

Whereas: DU has ample of experience, resources and infrastructures in Natural products, microbial diseases and possible therapeutic measures, Organic Synthesis, Medicinal Chemistry, evaluation of medicinal plants for their efficacy, safety and quality with in vitro and in vivo methods of various Bioassay methods, in addition to native culture, folklore and traditional studies, and develop Tribal Drug innovation Centre or Incubation centre.

### Whereas: The Central Tribal University, Andhra Pradesh (CTUPA)

herein after referred to as (CTUPA) is committed to the development of human resource capacity by providing wide range of academic training including inorganic, organic, synthetic and natural products and laboratory training and other subject matter specialists,

Whereas: Both parties wishes to form an alliance to promote the development of highly qualified professionals and conduct research together by the synergy of a collaborative and sharing approach.

Whereas: it is necessary to establish formal procedures defining the party's roles and responsibilities in term of such alliance or MoU,

Now therefore, the parties agree as follows,

#### CLAUSES

#### FIRST

The present agreement has been designed to facilitate university cooperation in both academic and research fields, during the course of higher education.

#### SECOND

In order to carry out this cooperative programme, both parties agree to:

- Communicate the results of their pedagogical experiences (courses, seminars, workshop, symposium, conferences etc.).
- Inform the partner institution about any congresses, debates, science meetings and seminars organized by each university, and exchange those documents and publications resulting from their activities.
- Promote, according to each university's regulations, teaching faculties and research scholars' participation in courses, conferences, seminars, congresses organized by the partner University, as stated.
- Promote, according to their possibilities, Teachers/Research scholars exchange program for a specified period of time, being academic or research activities, their main objectives. Exchanges shall be subject to the policies of the departments involved.
- Accept students from the sister institution provided they meet the requirements in force established by the host institution and under suitably established conditions.
   As regards medical insurance, the students shall be under the rules in force drawn up by the receiving institution.
- Both the concrete cooperation programs and the actions for students Exchange will require the signature of a specific agreement that will include, at least, the

number of students to be exchanged, the duration, the degrees offered, and any information that should be taken under consideration.

- · Identification of joint research areas and training.
- Provide hands on training on microbial infectious diseases and treatment measures, natural resistance, hereditary diseases and remedies, Pharmacognosy, Organic synthesis and synthesis and isolation of bioactive compounds related laboratory training for PhD students and academic staff of CTUPA.
- · Collaborate in mentoring/advising PhD and MSc students of CTUPA.
- Arranging host laboratory for PhD/MSc students and academic staff sponsored by CTUPA.
- Delivering PhD courses and laboratory training at CTUPA campus upon invitation.
- Arranging host laboratory for academic staff and student exchange sponsored by CTUPA.
- · Joint project proposal development and grant application.
- Recruits instructors and mentors for the trainings and mentorships mostly those who
  are subject matter expert from DU.
- Facilitate host for professors or teaching staff who will be involved in the training and research as per the University rules and regulation.
- Recruit Instructors and Mentors from DU as guest staff to CTUPA
- In collaboration with the DU, identifies and invites international and national experts for the teaching
- In collaboration with the DU, ensures and is involved in the recruitment and screening
  of candidates for the training.
- Ensures the conduct of training based on the agreed upon competency domains stipulated in the training curriculum;
- Sets requirements for graduation of PhD and MSc students involved in joint project

#### THIRD

The specific cooperative programmes shall be drawn up annually and appended to this agreement (if needed).

#### FOURTH

Each institution shall endeavour to reserve in their budgets the necessary funds for the application of the agreement and to obtain the complementary financial help or subsidies.

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#### FIFTH

Each institution will appoint a representative in order to define and organise the cooperation programmes between both institutions.

Prof. H. Lajipati Rai of CTUPA from Central Tribal University side and Prof. Gayathri Devaraja, Department of Microbiology and Dr. Nagaswarupa H P, Department of Chemistry from Davangere University, Davangere side will be in charge of drawing up the annual work calendar and deal with unsettled questions. They shall meet alternatively at both institutions unless otherwise stated.

#### SIXTH

The present agreement shall be passed by each institution's relevant Bodies and signed by their respective Vice Chancellors of University and shall enter into on the date of the final signature hereto.

The duration of this agreement is **Five** (5) years, unless denounced by three (3) month prior written notice and without affecting the completion of any activity underway at the time. The duration of the agreement can be extended by equal periods at the initiative of any of the parties, prior written agreement, before the date of its conclusion.

### SEVENTH

(First Party and Second Party are hereinafter jointly referred to as "Parties" and individually as 'party') as

- A) First Party is a Higher Educational Institution name:
  - (I) Davangere University, Shivagangotri, Davangere-577 007
- B) First Party & Second Party believe that collaboration and co-operation between themselves will promote more effective use of each of their resources, and provide each of them with enhanced opportunities.
- C) The Parties intent to cooperate and focus efforts on cooperation with area of Skill Based Training Education and Research.
- Both Parties, being legal entities in themselves desire to sign the MoU for advancing their mutual interests.
- E) Azymus Life science Pvt. ## Financial Arrangements

The financial obligations in meeting the requirements under various identified programmes and activities will be met as per the norms followed by respective organisations.

## Intellectual Property Rights

Each party will ensure appropriate protection of Intellectual Property Rights generated from cooperation pursuant to MoU, consistent with their respective laws, rules and regulations and international agreements to which both parties are committed. In case research is carried out solely and separately by the Party or the research results are obtained through the sole and separate effort of the Party, the party concerned alone will apply for grant of IPR and once granted, the IPR will be solely owned by the concerned party. In case of research results obtained through joint activities, the grant of intellectual property rights will be sought by both the parties jointly and once granted these rights will jointly have owned by the parties.

The Parties shall not assign any rights and obligations arising out of the IPR generated to inventions/activities carried out under the MoU to any third Party without consent of the other party.

In case of research results obtained through joint activities under this MoU, both the parties will apply as co-applicants for the protection of intellectual property rights in India. Commercialization in any other country shall be done jointly through a separate agreement.

## Publications

- B) First Party & Second Party believe that collaboration and co-operation between themselves will promote more effective use of each of their resources, and provide each of them with enhanced opportunities.
- C) The Parties intent to cooperate and focus efforts on cooperation with area of Skill Based Training, Education and Research.
- Both Parties, being legal entities in themselves desire to sign the MoU for advancing their mutual interests.
- E) Info Institute of Computer Education (IICE) is engaged in Business, Manufacturing, Education, Skill Based Trainings, Software Development, Placements and R&D services in the field of Computer Science.

It has 33 Post-Graduate Departments of Studies and Research on the main campus offering 33 post-graduate programmes and few Diploma Courses. The university endeavours to see that the students develop a holistic, humane and sustainable development oriented approach towards life and living. The focus of the university is to have an inclusive approach is to work towards generation, integration, dissemination and absorption of relevant up-to-date knowledge. Davangere University having its address at Davangere University. Shivagangothri campus, Davangere-577007. Karnataka. India

The university has 121 Colleges affiliated to it in total, with one Constituent College and two Autonomous College, offering Graduate and Post-Graduate programmes in various disciplines catering to the educational needs of more than 50,000 students. DU is seeking to improve understanding between their respective academic institutions and to establish collaborations mutually benefiting their students.
- C. The Parties are desirous of entering into this MoU to declare their respective intentions and to establish a basis of co-operation and collaboration between the Parties upon the terms as contained herein.

## NOW THE PARTIES HEREBY AGREE TO AS FOLLOWS:

## 1. SCOPE AND FIELDS OF ACADEMIC CO-OPERATIONS

- 1.1 The Parties agree to collaborate in the areas of:
  - Joint/Collaborative Research Projects and Joint Publications in the areas of Computer Science and its allied fields;
  - Visit of research students and academic staff of the Department of Studies in Computer Science and Allied departments of DU.
  - Post graduate and Doctoral Research Project work and training to be carried out at both UM and DU.
  - d) Organizing and participating in joint symposia, conferences, workshops and short-term courses conducted by both the institutions;
  - e) Any other areas of co-operation as agreed to by the Parties from time to time.
- 1.2 The Parties to this MoU agree to continue discussions and communication on the areas as identified in sub-clause 1.1 in respect of their implementation and in identifying each Party's function.

1.3 In the event the Parties so desire, they may enter into a separate legally binding supplementary agreement in respect of any area in sub-clause 1.1 subject to terms and conditions as mutually agreed to by both Parties.

## 2. DURATION AND TERMINATION

- 2.1 This MoU shall take effect on and from the date of execution of this MoU and shall continue to be effective for a period of five (5) years and may be extended for such further period as may be agreed by the Parties in writing.
- 2.2 Notwithstanding clause 2.1 above, this MoU may be terminated by either Party giving written notice to the other at least six (6) months prior to the proposed date of termination.
- 2.3 Notwithstanding clause 2.2 above, the provisions of this MoU or any other written agreement in respect of any on-going exchange programme or any other form of cooperative activity under this MoU shall continue to apply until their completion unless both Parties mutually agree in writing to the earlier termination of the programme or co-operative activity.
- 2.4 This MoU may be renewed under the same terms and conditions for a further period of five (5) year from the expiry date hereof by mutual written agreement of the Parties at least upon six (6) month prior to expiry date thereof.

- 6.3 The Parties acknowledge that this MoU does not in any way give rise to any right or permission to use or to be associated with each Party's intellectual property.

## 7. REVISION, VARIATION AND AMENDMENT

- 7.1 Either Party may request in writing a revision, variation or amendment of this MoU, which in force.
- 7.2 Any such revision, variation or amendment agreed to by the Parties shall be in writing and shall form part of this MoU.
- 7.3 Such revision, variation or amendment shall come into force on such date as may be determined by the Parties.
- 7.4 Any revision, variation or amendment shall not prejudice the implementation of any project, activity or co-operation arising from or based on this MoU before or up to the date of such revision, variation or amendment.

## 8. SUPERVENING EVENTS

8.1 Each Party reserves the right for reasons of national security, national interests, public order or public health to suspend temporarily, either in whole or in part, the implementation of this MoU which suspension shall take effect

immediately after notification has been given to the other Party.

8.2 Notwithstanding sub-clause 8.1, should any other event occur which hinders or restricts the implementation of this MoU, the Parties shall use their best endeavour to agree upon such action, as may be necessary and equitable, to remove the cause of such event.



DAVANGERE UNIVERSITY a company incorporated under the laws of UGC, India and having its business address at Davangere University, Shivagangotri Campus Davangere-577007, Karnataka, India (hereinafter referred to as "DU") of the other part.

UM and DU may individually be referred to as the "Party" or collectively as the "Parties".

#### WHEREAS

- DU and UM are of the view that there are synergistic benefits to be derived from the Parties collaboration by way of sharing and further developing the knowledge and expertise of both parties in relation to "Image & Video Processing And Artificial Intelligence".
- 2) DU and UM are desirous of formalizing this collaboration by entering into this Agreement subject to terms and conditions as stipulated herein

#### NOW THEREFORE THE PARTIES AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

#### 1. **DEFINITIONS**

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



  - a) The nature, scope and schedule of the academic collaboration, finance and significant resource sharing.
  - b) The form of the academic collaboration.


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c) Other provisions as may be mutually agreed upon, including provisions covering the consequences of default or termination by a participant, term, arbitration of disputes and applicable law.

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### 3. CONFIDENTIALITY

- 3.1 During and for a period of 5 (five) years from the date of disclosure, each party agrees to consider as confidential all information disclosed by the other party in written or tangible form or, if orally disclosed and confirmed in writing within 30 (thirty) days of disclosure and identified as confidential by the disclosing party.
- 3.2 The obligations above shall not extend to any confidential information for which the receiving party can prove that this information:
  - Is in the public domain at the time of disclosure or comes within the public domain without fault of the receiving party.
  - Is already known or become known to the receiving party;
  - Is received from a third-party having no obligations of confidentiality to the disclosing party;
  - Is independently developed by the receiving party; or
  - Is required to be disclosed by law or court order
- 3.3 The existence and subsistence of this MoU and any discussions and/or evaluations contemplated hereby are confidential in nature and shall be kept confidential and shall not be disclosed to any third-party without the prior written consent of the other party hereto.
- 3.4 Notwithstanding the foregoing, any party may make such public disclosure as it believes, on the advice of counsel, only in the event if required by law or by applicable stock exchange regulations, in which case such party shall consult with the other party and gain such party's written approval prior to making such disclosure.
- 3.5 Each institution will appoint a representative in order to define and organise the cooperation programmes between both institutions.

Prof. Gayathri Devaraja, Prof. Department of Studies in Microbiology from DU side and Dr. N. Udupa, Research Director from SDMU side will be in charge of drawing up the annual work calendar and deal with unsettled questions. They shall meet alternatively at both institutions unless otherwise stated.

### 4. LIMITATION OF LIABILITY

- 4.1. The parties agree that (i) the activities intended by this MoU may not be successfully completed; (ii) the results achieved may not be as anticipated; and (iii) these activities may not lead to any announced or generally available business engagement. Any decision by any party to forego, or engage any other business opportunity, to alter or supplement any business plan of direction, or to make any investment in anticipation of the consummation of any transaction contemplated hereunder, is at the sole discretion of the party electing to do so, and will not create any actual or potential liability or any obligation for the other party, even if that party is aware of, or has been informed of, or has indicated approval of, any such action, decision, or election.
- 4.2. Except for a breach of Clause 4, 11 and 12 for any claim in any way related to the subject matter of this MoU, the damaged party shall not be entitled to recover any actual and direct damages unless and until a definitive agreement has been signed. This will apply regardless of the form of action, whether in contract or in tort, including negligence. This limitation will not apply to claims for bodily injury or damage to real property or tangible personal property for which a party is legally liable. In no event will either party be liable for any lost profits, lost savings, incidental or indirect damages, or other economic consequential damages, even if advised of the possibility of such damages. In addition, neither party will be liable for any damages claimed by the other party based on any third-party claim.

#### 5. NON-EXCLUSIVITY

The relationship of the parties under this MoU shall be non-exclusive and both parties, including their affiliates, subsidiaries and divisions, are free to pursue other agreements or collaborations of any kind. However, when entering into a particular agreement, the parties may agree to limit each party's right to collaborate with others on that subject.

#### 6. TERMS AND TERMINATION

This MoU, unless extended by mutual written agreement of the parties, shall expire 5 (five) years after the effective date mentioned above. This MoU may be amended or terminated earlier by mutual written agreement of the parties at any time. Either party shall have the right to unilaterally terminate this MoU upon 60 (sixty) days prior written notice to the other party. However, no such early termination of this MoU, whether mutual or unilateral, shall affect the obligations of the participants under any agreement, Confidentiality clause as referenced in clause 4 above, or any other agreement entered into pursuant to this MoU, which obligations shall survive any such termination.

### 7. INDEMNITY

Each party hereby agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold the other party harmless from any and all claims, demands, costs, liabilities, losses, expenses and damages (including reasonable attorneys' fees, costs, and expert witnesses' fees) arising out of or in connection with breach of any of the provisions of this MoU. Indemnity is limited to the cost of the specific project.

### 8. RELATIONSHIP

Nothing in this MoU shall be construed to make either party a partner, an agent or legal representative of the other for any purpose.

#### 9. ASSIGNMENT

It is understood by the Parties that this MoU is based on the professional competence and expertise of each party and hence neither Party shall transfer or assign this MoU, or rights or obligations arising hereunder, either wholly or in part, to any third-party.

### 10. COSTS OF THE MoU

Each Party shall bear their respective costs of carrying out the obligations under this MoU.

### 11.PUBLICITY

SDMU and the DU each agree not to use the trademarks, trade names, services marks or other proprietary marks of the other party to this MoU in any advertising, press releases, publicity matters, or other promotional materials without prior written approval of the other party. In addition, each party agrees not to initiate or distribute any press releases, publicity matters, or other promotional materials related to or referencing the subject matter of this MoU without prior written approval of the other party. In case of breach of the clauses of publicity by either party, the parties would be at liberty to take action in accordance with Indian Laws for indemnification.

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

Bangalore Bioinnovation Centre (BBC) a section 8 Company having its registered office at Helix Biotech Park, Electronic City Phase 1, Bangalore – 560100, Karnataka and a bio-incubation center for startups in the field of Life Sciences, Pharma, MedTech, Agriculture, Food & Nutrition funded by Department of Electronics, IT, BT and S&T, Government of Karnataka with a liberal funding support from Department of Biotechnology (DBT) Government of India. The Centre is a world class incubation Centre with Central Instrumentation facility in a 10-acre campus with total builds up area of 60,000 sq. ft. (hereinafter referred to as 'BBC')

### AND

**Department of Studies in Biotechnology, Davangere University,** Shivagangothri, Davangere located at Davangere University, Shivagangothri, Davangere – 577007, Karnataka (hereinafter referred to as "**Department of Studies in Biotechnology**").

Which expression shall, unless repugnant to the context or meaning thereof include and be deemed to include its, successors-in-interest and permitted assigns,

WHEREAS, each party referred to individually as "Party" and jointly as "Parties" have intended to enter into an MoU according to the terms and conditions stated below.

### Purpose of this Memorandum of Understanding

The purpose of this Memorandum of Understanding is to establish collaboration between the Parties to promote academic bio-entrepreneurship, promotion of spinouts and facilitate commercialization of technologies developed by Department of Studies in Biotechnology, Davangere University, Shivagangothri, Davangere in broad areas of Life Sciences. ### **Areas of Cooperation**

1. BBC is established with the aim of fostering innovation ecosystem through translational research by start-ups/entrepreneurs in the broad areas of Life Sciences viz., Health Care (MedTech/Pharma/Bio-Pharma), Agriculture, Food/Nutrition, Industrial Biotechnology and Environmental Biotechnology and take it forward to commercialization; Build



capabilities of human resources (Students, research scholars and faculty) through skill development, Hands-on training, short-term training in the areas of mutual interest. Boost up the research and academic standards by specific programmes such as study trip, student placements. Collaborate on society relevant R&D projects.

- 2. Department of Studies in Biotechnology, Davangere University, Shivagangothri, Davangere (Party 2) is established with the aim of supporting various academic programmes. Taking up collaborative research projects to support training or operate demonstration projects to promote rural innovation for developing Biotechnology based products and to promote/popularize the use of biotechnological process and tools for creating employment opportunities in rural areas. To conduct national and international symposium, workshops, seminars and conferences in related fields.
- 3. The Parties agree to cooperate, in the context of their respective mandates, policies and resources, for the purposes of promoting bio-entrepreneurship especially in the field of Life Sciences through technical cooperation, capacity-building, training and commercialization of technologies.
- 4. The Parties agree to act as a link between the Department of Studies in Biotechnology and the start-ups incubated at Bangalore Bioinnovation Centre (BBC) and facilitate the transfer of knowledge/technologies through training programs and/or webinars.
- 5. The Parties will strive towards strengthening research and development through joint research programs and bring out more spinouts.
- 6. The Parties agree to carry out common research projects in the relevant field and to discuss the obtained results in order to publish articles or IP protection and to participate at Scientific/National/International Conferences, Seminars, Workshops and Meetings.
- 7. Bangalore Bioinnovation Centre (BBC) to facilitate the commercialization of technologies developed in the college in the field of Life Sciences.
- 8. Bangalore Bioinnovation Centre (BBC) to provide access to instrumentation and infrastructure facilities for collaborative research projects, to the students/scholars/faculty of Department of Studies in Biotechnology, Davangere University, Davangere as per the policies of Bangalore Bioinnovation Centre (BBC).
- 9. Bangalore Bioinnovation Centre (BBC) to facilitate Internships / Student Projects, Industrial visit for the students.



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- 10. The Parties agree to jointly conduct events such as workshops, training and skill development programmes, conferences, webinars etc., to capacitate the researchers and faculty.
- 11. The Parties agree to jointly conduct field specific events in the area of technology commercialization and entrepreneurship.
- 12. The "Parties" referred to in this MOU below shall meet as necessary to review the fields of cooperation.

### Scope and Implementation of MoU

- 1. The Party having the responsibility to organize an agreed activity under this Memorandum of Understanding, shall apply its own administrative and financial regulations and comply with its own practices, unless provided otherwise in this MoU. It shall apply its own practice in terms of organization, logistical arrangements and other activity-specific matters, unless otherwise agreed between the Parties.
- 2. For agreed activities organized by a Party and financed, in full or in part, by the other party, administrative and financial modalities shall be defined in advance between the Parties.

Receiving Party shall not disclose confidential information of disclosing party to any third party or otherwise use such confidential information for any purpose other than for performing this MOU.
- 2. Each Party shall comply with all applicable laws including laws pertaining to privacy, data protection, confidentiality, drug control laws, and environmental laws in the performance of this MOU.
- 3. Either party does not make any representation or warranty that the proposed collaboration shall ensure commercial viability or success of any joint research project or any other warranty, expressed or implied.
- 4. If either Party is delayed in performing an obligation under this MOU by strike, lockout, or other labor troubles of a Third Party; by restrictive governmental or judicial order or by riots, insurrection, war, inclement weather, or Acts of God including any endemic or pandemic; performance is excused for the period of such delay. The Party affected by such Force Majeure event shall promptly notify the other in writing of the delaying event.
- 5. The relationship hereby established between the Parties is solely that of the independent contractors. This MOU shall not create any agency, partnership, or joint venture relationship.
- 6. This MOU may be executed in counterparts, each of which shall be considered an original and all of which shall constitute one and the same document for all purposes.
