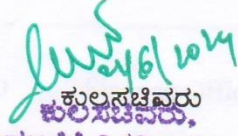

I feel it a privilege to present the 14th Annual Report of Davangere University for the Academic year 2022-23. This Annual Report contains the information pertaining to our University's courses/programs, activities; details of basic infrastructural facilities; college wise results; sports activities; student facilities; research collaborations; NSS, NCC, YRC activities and other relevant details. All the details of Academic and Administrative activities of the Davangere University, Shivagangotri campus, Jnanagangotri PG Centre, G.R. Halli, Chitradurga, Fine Arts College, Davangere, University First Grade College, Turuvanuru and University First Grade College, Hariyabbe are included in this report.

Our University has teaching faculties who are actively involved in teaching, research and outreach programs. We have adopted the CBCS from the year 2018. The syllabi have been updated and improvised regularly. Almost 90 special interdisciplinary courses and 17 Value Added Courses have been implemented in various departments in 2022-2023.

Currently in this academic year, a total of 42220 students have enrolled in the University. 37667 students have got admission to UG and 4537 are doing their PG courses. The administrative sections of our University are functioning efficiently. The teaching faculties are actively involved in teaching and research as per their specializations. We have 63 H-index in SCOPUS and 52 H-index in Web of Science - which shows that we are being recognized as one of the important research institutes. Our faculties have received various grants and fellowships from both the State and Central Governments. In fact, 21 MoUs and research collaborations with eminent Universities and Research organizations proves the above mentioned fact. Many department faculty and students have enrolled for SWAYAM, NPTEL courses and have successfully completed them. The University has recently established USEC, IPR Cell, Food Processing Centre, Materials Development and Skill Development Centers. Many patents have been given to IPR Cell which boosts our research activities.

Our University was established in 2009, but has a history of 42 years. In 1979 it was a PG Centre of University of Mysore, and from 1987 it was under the Kuvempu University. Since 2009 it is functioning as an independent University.

I am greatly indebted to paramapoojya shri shri shri 1103 Shivamurthy shivacharya swamiji of Sirigere Taralabalu bruhanmutt and Hon'ble Ex- chief minister Shri B S Yeddiurappa Ji for helping in the establishment of our University. I extend heartfelt thanks to our land donors to establish then P.G. Centre viz., Hon'ble Secretary of Bapuji Educational Association and Ex-minister Dr. Shamanur Shivashankarappaji and Rajanally Maddurayappa Laxmanashetty Trust for donating 48 acres and 24 acres respectively. As a result of which, this center has now grown-up as an independent University. My thanks to the Government of Karnataka, Hon'ble Chief Minister of Karnataka Sri Basavaraj Bommai ji, the Higher Education Minister Dr. C N Ashwath Narayan ji, Sri G.M. Siddeshwara ji, MP, Ex Central Minister for Heavy Industries, Sri. S. A.Ravindranath ji (MLA) and Prof. Linganna ji (MLA), Sri S.S. c. Administrative and academic reforms ushered in based on NAAC Peer Team Administrative and Academic Audit (AAA) Committee Recommendations and reports (copies of recommendations /reports may be annexed)

- Efforts were made by all the faculty members of the department towards further strengthening of the mentor and mentee system.
- Faculty members of the various department made 11 MoUs and 07 collaborations.
- The faculty members of the department published 520 research papers in various leading journals/edited volumes/conference proceedings, 07 Ph.D. degree

awarded, 36 patents registered. 30 awards were received by the faculty members towards their research output.

- The research papers of the various faculty members were well cited with Scopus index of 10572 and Web of Science of 7542. H-index: scopus 50 and web of science 43.
- Total of 22 projects were sanctioned with a grant of 43 lakhs from Government and Non-Government agencies.
- Around 90 inter-disciplinary courses were promoted in PG programs of the University.
- University with the help of RUSA fund developed high end instruments facility.
- Department of political science conducted mock parliament for students as part of their scheme of teaching and evaluation.
- All the PG departments of the University promoted SWAYAM/MOOCs/NPTEL courses among the students. Around 1406 students enrolled for the said courses.
- Total of 17 value added courses were offered in the PG Departments.
- English language lab facilities is provided for all the students of PG Departments.
- Regular coaching classes are conducted for the students towards KSET, NET, JRF and other exams.
- Total of 34 research methodology programs/Skill Development programs were conducted.

d. Administrative measures for networking and development of PG centers/additional campuses, on par with main campuses:

- The University has developed adequate networking facilities on par with the main campus at its PG centre at Chitradurga and Visual Arts College, Davangere.
- Conduct of Syndicate meeting once in a year at PG Center, Guddada Rangavvana Halli, Chitradurga as an administrative reform.
- Hostel facilities for boys and girls are provided.
- Well furnished Auditorium facility is provided
- Adequate teaching and non-teaching staff are available
- Well CC roads are connected to all the buildings in the PG centre with CCTV surveillance
- Gym facility is provided for the students.

Faculty of Commerce and Management: Financial Inclusion, dairy farming, SDGs, Green accounting, Women empowerment, social welfare development programs, New age leadership,

f. Promotion of excellence in higher education:

- Emphasized on outcome based education (OBE) across all the UG and PG programs.
- Research led PG and UG programs are offered
- Industry collaborations are established
- Conduct of National and International conferences for networking of professionals.
- Seedfund for the young faculty members to promote societal research

g. Initiatives taken to promote overall development of the University:

- NEP based curriculum is adopted to UG programs.
- Provided specilaboratory facilities for science faculty members.
- Food processing centre is developed.
- Encouraged faculty members to visit premier institutions like IISC, foreign unviersties etc. as visiting scientists.
- Initiated Green campus activities.
- Developed mini – forest in the campus.
- Initiated Rain water harvesting and borewell recharge.

h. Welfare measures for SC/ST/OBC/women/Divyangia and Others:

SC/ST Cell

- The cell awards fellowships and contingency amount to Ph.D. Scholars, Study tour, Preparation of Project work/Dessertation, UGC/JRF/NET/SET coaching facilities, career guidance, computer language proficiency, personality development and banking examination coaching are given.
- SC/ST Cell extends free hostel and reimbursement of fees from Government.
- The Cells monitor various activities including fellowships & scholarships, Fee reimbursement Grants and Vidyasiri scholarship sanctioned from Government.

OBC Cell :

- Collection and circulation, and making it understand to students with regard to UGC orders on various aspects of facilties and education.
- Davangere University has provided special Fellowship to OBC students,
- KPSC/UPSC/Banking examination coaching.
- Grievances redressal cell addresses the problems of students.

Divyangia Cell

- A special Cell has been established for Divyangi students.
- Ramps have been constructed in all academic and administrative buildings and wheel chairs are provided at every buildings.
- Special washrooms with good facilities have been established in the Hostels. Special lecture/workshops have been organized.

i. Promotion of Kannada in all its celebrated forms:

Kannada is used as an official language of the University. The usage of Kannada was made routine practice in all administrative formats except international office to help access to the local communication system. Most of the paper works like notices and circulars are drafted in Kannada for official transactions to facilitate the use of Kannada in all aspects of work at the University.

- University web-site is also reframed in dual language (Kannada and English)
- Prasaraṅga is much focussed on publishing Kannada books/theses/monographs.

J. Initiatives to mobilize finance through PPP, alumni/ alumnae association etc,

- Various Departments of the University have the alumni association. Through the alumni association, they mobilize the funds from students and research scholars for various curriculuar and non-curriculuar activities.
- Various Donors and faculty members sponsors gold medals to various rank holders.

k. Innovative measures to ensure announcement of results before commencement of next semesters of UG and PG degree courses:

- Davanagere University examination process is fully computerized and it captures all the students data required for examination process.
- Student data is directly imported from online admission process.
- SEE Admission cards are made available online to students.
- SEE theory Marks, Practical marks and IA marks entry are made online
- Computerized Coding of answer scripts.

3. Vision and Mission:

4. Organization and Administration:

a. Procedures to address Intra and inter campus administration:

- The Vice-Chancellor is the Head of the Institution; He is assisted by the Registrar (Administration), Registrar (Evaluation), Finance officer and the Deans of all the Faculties in academic and administrative matters.
- As the Chairperson, the Syndicate and the Academic Council, the Vice-Chancellor ensure the smooth functioning of the University in the development and implementation of policies framed.
- At the department level, the Chairperson/Coordinator plays a leadership role in both academic and administrative matters.
- The University provides necessary support and encouragement to its affiliated colleges to become autonomous. The University has made statutes in this regard.
- The University always encourages the participation of all stakeholders by creating conducive, participatory intellectual ambience. All academic decisions are taken after deliberation at the department, faculty, and university levels providing opportunity for younger members to articulate their viewpoint.
- In addition, teachers are nominated to important Committees, to hold administrative positions (as Registrar, Registrar (Evaluation), Finance officer and Development sectors). This grooms strong leadership.

All the vacancies in administrative/technical/support which are approved by the Government are filled.

c. Campus security (main and other campuses):

- For campus security, ex-servicemen and required manpower have been obtained through outsourcing in main and other campuses.

- The supervisors are patrolling the campus every hour.

- Organising appropriate training modules to the existing staff to record and maintain the database of the University for their routine work.
- Creation of a directory of scientists/noted educationalists and scientific institution for interaction of the faculty members and scholars.
- Liaisoning with funding agencies/Departments/Teachers/Scholars to promote collaborative and interdisciplinary academic endeavours.
- Planning and organizing meetings of the Planning, Monitoring and Evaluation Board from time to time in consultation with the Vice-Chancellor.

The University strictly complies the Government notifications issued on the recommendations of KSHEC status report.

Davangere University regards it as a privilege to assist the community's people who are Divyang/ Differently abled. We have a policy in place to ensure that the campus is accessible to those with disabilities, and every attempt has been made to ensure that the Divyangjan has a barrier-free environment to learn in.

CONCESSIONS FOR DIVYANGJAN:

- According to an order issued by the Government of Karnataka, the University would waive the tuition cost as well as the special charge for students who have impairments.
- Additional salary is provided to Divyang as per Government orders.
- To encourage students with impairments from rural backgrounds to continue higher education, the dormitory cost is eliminated in some circumstances under specific conditions.
- A free ship is often given as an Institutional scholarship to encourage students with impairments to pursue higher education.
- Higher education specially to pursue Ph.D. for visual impaired provided in addition to conventional system.

SERVICES FOR DIVYANGJAN:

The Centre is comprised of an Enabling Unit, a Barrier-Free Centre, adapted material Production units, an adapted library, Training Courses, Awareness - raising Programs, and Academic Programs designed specifically for the differently abled. Various schemes of the University Grants Commission (UGC) and the Government of Karnataka are being initiated and successfully executed by the University for the welfare of the differently abled.

Every year, a special committee comprised of an expert from the area, a faculty member from the Department of Human Development, the University Counsellor, and the coordinator of the Family and Child Enrichment Centre

reviews the concessions and makes any necessary changes. Apart from that, children with learning impairments have the option to confer with the team, as well as their parents, in order to choose the discipline that is most suited to their ability.

The procedure is as follows:

- A meeting with his/her parents and peers is being planned to ascertain potential interests during counselling.
- Suggestions for appropriate discipline are given.
- If the student wants, he/she may seek a modification in discipline in accordance with the recommendation.
- Students and their parents are educated about the concessions.
- Additionally, if necessary, the committee can offer a particular list of concessions for a student.

SENSITISATION PROGRAMS:

The University organises public and student awareness-raising activities such as Rallies, Human Chains, Walkathons, Signature Campaigns, and Awareness Brochures on the themes of disability prevention, disability rights, inclusion and human rights for people with disabilities through Coordinator, Divyang cell Davangere University.

Disability inclusive pedagogy, and technology that help students with disabilities are being brought to the attention of faculty and higher education. Librarians and volunteers are being educated on their roles in creating a more inclusive society alongside students from different fields.

THE INFRASTRUCTURE AND THE PHYSICAL SUPPORT:

- All classrooms have wooden study chairs with writing pads attached.
- For left-handed pupils, there are special study chairs.
- A particular brand of chair and table to meet the needs of pupils with special needs (students with physical disabilities or on medical grounds).

RESTROOMS:

- Students (students who are / physically handicapped / for medical reasons) have access to the western toilet and special washrooms are constructed at Hostels.

o. Grievance redressal mechanism.

The University has established “Students Grievance redressal Cell’ under Directorate of Student welfare office, to provide a mechanism for redressal of student grievances and ensure transparency and prevention of unfair practices. For this, a nodal officer has been appointed to monitor and respond to students’ grievances. Students from Davangere University and its affiliated colleges can lodge complaints through “online students Grievances Redressal Portal” of UGC (web site: www.ugc.ac.in/), New Delhi, related to admission process, nontransparent or any unfair evaluation practices, provisions of students amenities, alleged discrimination of students, etc. Very few grievances were received from students and these were readdressed through discussion and counseling.

Grievances from students were redressed by the system as well as by direct representation to the Head of the Department. Separate cells are in place for student grievances, such as prevention of sexual harassment of women staff and students. The grievances of faculty and non-teaching staff can be addressed to the heads, and also directly to the Vice-chancellor/Registrar. Adequate measures are taken to redress all grievances. Most of the grievances are redressed through counseling and discussion.

p. Placement cell and campus Recruitment:

Post-Graduate departments of the university have been organizing campus interviews. It helps students to find placement. The University Placement Training cell monitors placement services for the students.

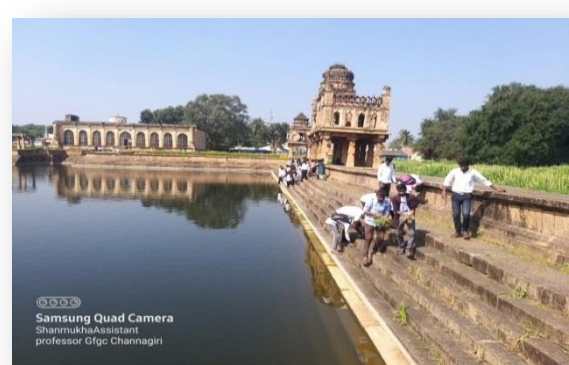

17. Curricular Design and Development :

- All the official correspondence from the office Honorable Vice Chancellor and office of the Registrar are in Kannada.

- All the official correspondence from various departments of the university are in Kannada.
- Translation and comparative studies are a part of our curriculum. Rural Student/Students are also taught in Kannada language along with English language.

ii. Centre for International Language

- English language laboratory has been set in the university campus.
- It's mandatory for all the PG students to get benefit out of this lab with 2 credit course in various semesters under CBCS scheme.
- Currently only English lab has been set up and planning to setup international add-on language courses for all the students in coming days.

iii. New and novel courses introduced with due emphasis on skill development and employability.

- All the PG Departments of the University, identified the courses on skill development and employability and made it as a part of their scheme of teaching and evaluation.

iv. Interdisciplinary courses introduced

Interdisciplinary open-elective courses have been offered for PG students, in which students can opt for any open-elective courses offered by the various PG departments. The students enrolled under open-elective courses will be thought at respective departments of courses offered for 2hrs/week which is 2 credit courses.

About Davangere University:

Now it is befitting to present a brief report about our University’s accomplishments on various fronts since its inception. Educational scenario is bright in Davangere and Chitradurga Districts.

There are many educational institutes, which cater to the educational needs of the Districts. With all these aspirations, Davangere University was established on 18th August 2009 and is one of the youngest Universities in Karnataka by being carved out of Kuvempu University with a vision to meet the educational aspirations of the people of these regions. The University has a total area of **259 acres and** spread over in five campuses. The ambiance of the campus flooded with greenery, young students and energetic staff is one of the striking features of the University. Our University has just completed 10 years its existence and making strides in academic field.

Academic Programs:

The University offers a wide range of PG courses in the Faculties of Science, Arts, Commerce and Management and Education. All possible measures are taken to impart quality of higher education in accordance with the UGC Higher Education Policies with a view to provide access to higher education for various sections of the society. There are 24 Courses at Post-Graduate level. M.Phil. and Ph.D. Programs are also being offered.

The problems associated with Covid-19 pandemic are well-known. In order to provide social justice to the needy and to give recognition to the inclusive policy, reservation for admission to various courses is followed as per the provisions of government of Karnataka and Karnataka State Universities Act, 2000. The University has the pride of owning a constituent college, ***College of Visual Arts***. Recently, Government First Grade College, Thruvanur, Chitradurga district has been made as Constituent College of our University. All academic and administrative aspects of college will be

taken up the University for Overall Development.

Infrastructure and Amenities:

The University has provided certain modern facilities for students. Some classrooms are provided with smart boards and LCD projectors with internet connectivity. Though the University itself is newly established with only 18 permanent teachers and 08 newly appointed and non-teaching staff members. All the teachers take care of overall development of the students who study in the campus and also take up administrative responsibility. They try to create a student friendly atmosphere on the campus. University has provided Wi-Fi connectivity to the entire campus.

The **University Library** is housed in new and beautiful building, “**Jnanasoudha**” and is well equipped with **42,226** reference and text books, **52** journals on current subjects, **2,000** back volumes of periodicals, and good number of Government and Institution reports. Library provides services like internet, email and e-journals facilities to students, teachers and research scholars of all the Departments. The library is getting e-journals under UGC-INFONET program. Additionally, the library provides 3312 books for SC/ST students and 905 books for OBC students.

Recruitment of teachers:

Earlier the University was functioning with only 18 permanent faculty and over 100 guest faculties. A long term desire of the University to have permanent faculty in different subjects was fulfilled this year. With able support of education and finance departments of Government of Karnataka 125 teaching faculty positions are filled with highly qualified teachers. The newly recruited teachers include 05 Professors, 32 Associate professors and 88 Assistant Professors. With induction of new faculty various academic programs are making rapid advances.

Research Front:

All the faculty members are involved actively in research. More than **Rs. 5 crores** worth extra-mural funds are generated from funding agencies such as ICMR, DST, DBT, BRNS, UGC, K-VGST etc. Around **500** research papers have been published by our faculty. The newly recruited staff members were successful in obtaining STARTUP grants from UGC and also considered for K-VGST schemes.

Social Justice:

The University takes due care of the students belonging to the categories through its SC/ST and

OBC cells. Ph.D., fellowships, EBL and other scholarships are also provided to the students. Laptops were also provided to Ph.D. Scholars, Special training is provided to the students belonging to SC/ST/OBC categories in order to nurture their potentialities and help them in getting jobs. Coaching classes were conducted to prepare them for examinations such as IAS, KAS, KPSC, UGC-NET, SLET etc. The students belonging to SC/ST and OBC are provided with additional books for their reference.

Social Commitment:

University has planned to adopt ten villages from both the districts for academic and social development. In this regard already survey has been completed and work plan for over all development is being prepared. At the same time ten government schools will be identified for upgradation by the university.

Prasaranga :

The University established Prasaranga, this year for the scholarly publications. Since its formation - Prasaranga is actively engaged in publishing books in different disciplines of arts, science, drama, critics, management etc. More than 120 books are getting ready to be published by Prasaranga. Our University made MoU with Kannada University, Hampi for quality/technical publications.

NSS Activities:

Students are encouraged to actively participate in **NSS activities**. Village adoption, campus cleaning, awareness creation, maintaining green campus is the glaring features of the NSS unit in the university. MSW Department is actively involved insensitization programs such as blood donation camps, Women's empowerment programs, treatment of Girl Child, HIV/AIDS awareness, Environmental awareness.

Sports Activities :

Various sports events being organized in the University and affiliated Colleges. University selection for inter-collegiate and inter-University competitions are being held every year. At national level our University students have won Gold, Silver and Bronze Medals. Such students are being encouraged and felicitated by the University. Recently our university students participated in Russeling competition at Guru Jameshwara Uniersity, Hissar, Haryana and won the second place.

In South zone Volley Ball competition our University represented and won over Krishna University, Andhra Pradesh. In various sports events our university students have represented at state/national level.

ICT initiatives :

As a Government drive, the **ICT initiatives** have been taken up, letter monitoring and files movement are done through it for the purpose of maintaining transparency and governance. A separate ICT wing has been established and the entire administration is brought under this cell. Our University has been nationally recognized for its ICT initiative.

IQAC :

Assessment and Accreditation is broadly used for understanding the “Quality Status” of an institution. In the context of Higher Education, the accreditation status indicates that the particular Higher Educational Institution (HEI) – a College, a University, or any other recognised Unit therein, meets the standards of quality as set by the Accreditation Agency, in terms of its performance, related to the educational processes and outcomes, covering the curriculum, teaching-learning, evaluation, faculty, research, infrastructure, learning resources, organisation, governance, financial well-being and student services. In this context ***I am proud to express that our young University has been awarded with ‘B’ Grade by NAAC.*** From the past one year IQAC is actively engaged in conducting various academic programs. Even during the Covid-19 situation our IQAC conducted 25 different programs in higher education inviting education experts from various fields. We are preparing ourselves for the next NAAC evaluation. All faculty members are working hard to improve the University curriculum and training.

Biodiversity documentation:

Our University campus proudly considered as the Green and Clean campus. Boosted with more than 7000 trees the campus provides ambinent conditions for not only academic work but also for bio-diversity. The campus is documented to have 72 bird species and 38 butterflies along with other flora and fauna.

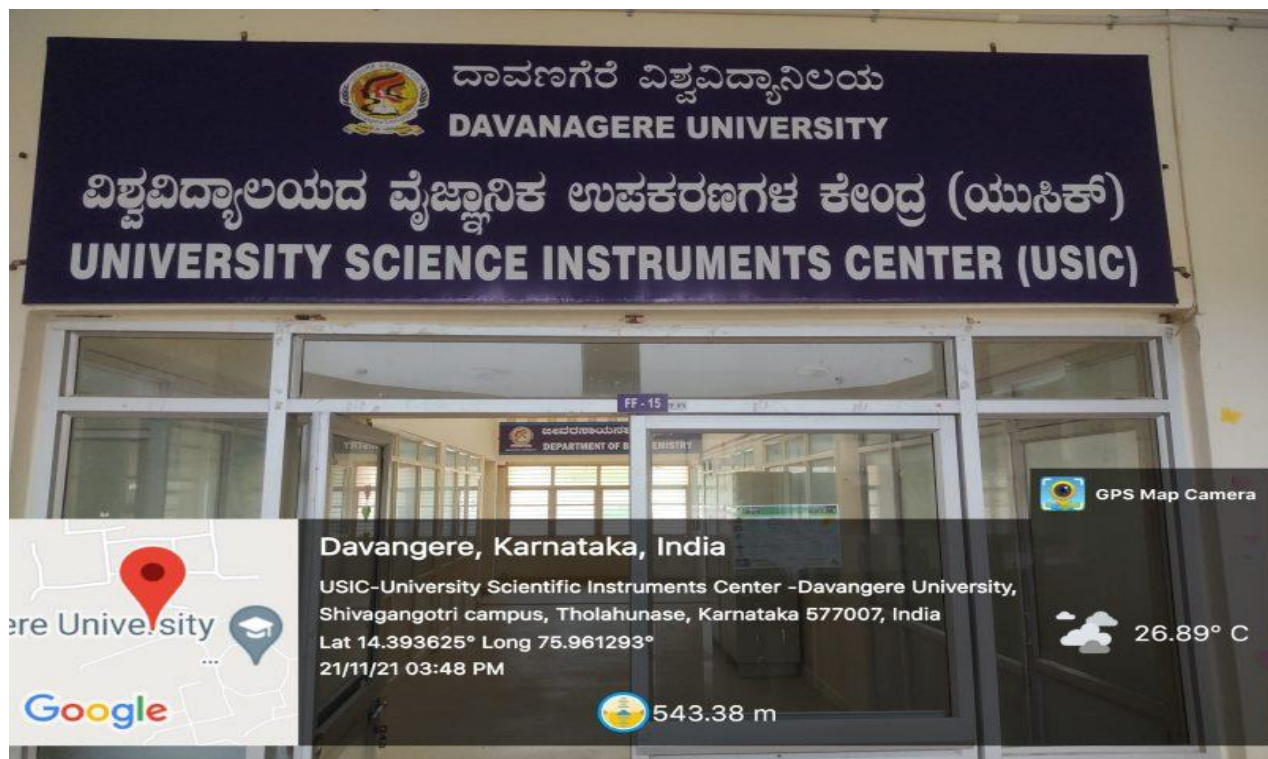

2. Students' Mentoring System

Best Practice No. : 1

1.Title of the Practice: Promotion of Research Activities

2. Objectives of the Practice:

The main objectives of the proposed practice is to develop a multi-dimensional research culture at the university to meet the proposed vision and mission through advance and translational research outputs. The state-of-the-art facilities created for research integrating interdisciplinary approach to maximize the utility and promoting innovative ideas into practical applications. The practices were structured to give flexibility for inter-university, institution and industry through Linkages, MoUs and Collaborations to accomplish the desired research outputs of social relevance in terms of publications and patents.

The core objectives constitute:

- 1. To improve and set up a good research culture, innovations in core research areas in the campus.
- 2. To encourage faculty and researchers to undertake advanced and translational projects, mobilize funds and obtain patents.

3. To develop and improve national and international collaborations
4. To improve National and International collaborations.

3. The Context:

Research plays an important role in the growth and overall development of all Higher Education Institutions. The University is committed to fulfil its vision and mission to provide excellent research facilities by enabling the research students to complete their dream projects. All the necessary assistance is provided to the students to overcome the difficulties while doing research by providing **centralized science instrumentation** facilities and **digital access to e-journals**. The University has supported research students by providing **fellowships, seed money** for innovative research ideas and creating research lab spaces and centre of excellence. Moreover, the University has designed a policy to facilitate National and International Collaborations to establish an effective research implementation of National and Global reputation. It recognizes and honours research output from the university to draw attention from an aspiring industries and institutions for Collaborative funding and provides opportunity for aspiring research students to pursue their research ambitions.

4. The Practice:

To establish a professional environment in research along with teaching, the following practices have been implemented:

1. Faculty members are encouraged to submit their research articles to peer reviewed journals having good impact factor, citation index, database index and others. Research papers published are collected and accessed via IQAC each academic year through Self-Assessment Reports (SAR) submitted by the faculty members. Based on this, best research publications among each faculty will be identified.

2. To keep in phase with the advances in the respective areas of research specialization, the faculties are encouraged to attend conference and seminars organized by Professional Societies, Institutions; workshops on frontiers of Arts, Sciences, Commerce, management and Linguistics for individual training in premier research organizations. The University provides partial financial support to faculty members for attending conferences organized in India and abroad.
3. To increase the breadth of good research and meet out the potentiality of teachers, faculty members are being encouraged to submit project proposals to various funding agencies through a **Research and Extension Cell** of the University within the period of each academic year. In addition to this, University has initiated and sanctioned seed money in the name of **DUSMYTR** (Davangere University Seed Money to Young Teachers for Research) Project during the academic year 2019-20 and 2020-21.
4. Collaborative research works between the University teachers and researchers outside the institutions having high reputation are encouraged to improve the quality of research, optimize the research output, research impact, research network and embrace the new challenges towards research.
5. The geographical location of the university deprives and restricts the accessibility of students and faculty members to high quality research facilities. The creation of state-of-the-art research facility at the university provides regional advantage in facilitating research outcomes at the campus and excel with national reputation. All these activities are being conducted to bring out the hidden talent of budding researchers of this region.

5. Evidence of Success:

1. Based on the criteria laid down by the IQAC, the best research publications of the faculties are identified and published in the University publication

unit, **Prasaranga** and as a token of **appreciation, certificates** are issued to the concerned Research scholars.

2. During the **last five years, more than 100 project proposals are submitted** to various funding agencies, like UGC New Delhi, DST-SERB, CSIR, DBT, ISSER, VGST Government of Karnataka etc. Research projects have been sanctioned from various funding agencies to several faculty members, both individually and also collaboratively. Further, to explore the innovative abilities of young teachers to develop prototypes, models and also to encourage them to involve in research related activities to the need of the society, University has sanctioned seed money in the name of DUSMYTR (Davangere University Seed Money to Young Teachers for Research) Project. **Forty-eight faculty members** have been recognized and availed seed money to carry out their research activities.
3. Research Collaborations and Linkages have been established to venture research prospective with Universities, institutions and industries in India and abroad through MoU's, the same has been reflected through collaborative research publications representing the contributing institutions.

6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required:

The University has recently recruited a good number of skilled faculty members for the vacant posts for most of the disciplines. In order to inculcate research bent of mind, the director office of the research has conducted many orientations and workshops on research methodology to create awareness about the code of conduct of research, publication ethics and plagiarism. The university had a lack of research laboratory space and equipment management for fresh recruits and steps have been taken to accommodate the research through inter laboratory and inter disciplinary collaborations. The university had a deficiency in research collaborations with reputed organizations. The research aspiring new recruits have ventured new opportunities to establish MoU's and Linkages with institutes

and Universities of high global repute. Earlier, there was a limitation in accessing e- resources to facilitate competitive research, which was addressed by establishing digital library which helps in accessing available e-resources through Inflibnet. In the recent past subdued response from various funding agencies has hindered the research projects. However, several discussions have been made to overcome these hurdles to promote research culture in the campus.

7. Notes:

A good number of quality research publications have been published in a globally recognized Scopus indexed journals with an impact factor ranging from 1 to 14 as research outcomes. The quality of the research output has been reflected in terms of National and International patents.

Best Practice No. : 2

1. Title of the Practice: Students' Mentoring System

2. Objective of the Practice

- To enhance students' self-esteem and academic performance by boosting their confidence and expanding their knowledge base.
- Providing assistance in determining the appropriate educational enrichment programme to build their career.
- Counselling to mentee's during Covid-19 Pandemic to provide moral support.

3. The Context

Mentor-mentee relationships are established with the goal of bridging the gap that exists between instructors and students and supporting students in both scholastic and personal issues. During the Covid-19 epidemic period, mentoring has shown to be a successful and popular method for giving much needed moral support, advice and assistance to students and their family. The effectiveness of

mentoring also contributes to the achievement of programme objectives, which ensures continuity and stability throughout the time. Davangere University's mentor-mentee program's primary goal is to help students reach their full potential in both academics and the workplace by optimizing the abilities of each individual.

4. The Practice

Mentor-mentee Scheme is implemented in each department on the University campus, where a group of 15-18 students (depending on the department's demand ratio) are allotted by the Chairman to each faculty member within their department in the Department Council meet. They serve as mentors to the allotted students in the duration of the course. Mentors plan weekly sessions with these small group throughout the first two weeks of semester. Mentor exposes novice students to university support systems, language, and academic standards and facilities available . This allows new students to embrace the challenges and opportunities that university offers, while making them aware of their responsibilities. Mentors will gather basic information such as medical conditions, native language, permanent address, educational information of the families, assistance in temporary housing, etc. Each mentor meets the mentees at least once a month. During these meets students may discuss academic and personal problems with their mentors. Additionally, the mentor counsels and advises the students on personal and academic matters. Mentors are also accessible through text, email, and mobile phone. The mentor will record each meeting on the Mentor Log Sheet and would take corrective/remedial measures in response to their mentees' issues by interacting with the local guardians of the students or by mentioning them in their subsequent monthly reports.

5. Evidence of Success

When the two-year journey of mentoring is nearing completion, a mentor's responsibility is to guarantee that his or her mentee has developed into a self-

sufficient and self-managed individual and a socially responsible citizen. The student mentoring system that has been implemented at the institution is designed to assist students in their overall growth, including their academic achievement, career development, moving along the proper path, and remaining focused in relevant aspects. During Covid-19 pandemic, mentors were regularly monitoring their mentees about the status of their health, studies and other issues by giving more emphasis regarding their mental status. The same report has been submitted to the Registrar through the Chairman of the concerned departments.

6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required

When it comes to mentoring, it is important to have dedicated teaching assistants (assistance) that strive/s to assist students beyond the traditional classroom. All these mentors have been briefed on several occasions and trained to handle the issues. The main task of mentors is to help the wards to express their problems and find a suitable approach to solve the same.
