I feel it a privilege to present the 16th Annual Report of Davangere University for the Academic year 2024-25. This Annual Report contains the information pertaining to our University's programs, activities, details of basic infrastructural facilities, college wise results, sports activities, student facilities, research publication and collaborations, NSS, NCC, YRC activities and other relevant details.

All the details of Academic and Administrative Activities of the Davangere University, Shivagangotri campus, Jnanagangotri PG Centre, G.R. Halli, Chitradurga, Fine Arts College, Davangere, University First Grade College, Turuvanuru and University First Grade College, Hariyabbe are included in this report.

Our University has young teaching faculty who are actively involved in teaching, research and outreach programs. We have adopted the CBCS from the year 2018. The syllabi have been updated and improvised regularly. Almost 90 interdisciplinary courses and 17 Value Added Courses were implemented in various departments in 2024-2025.

Currently, in this academic year, total of 43,587 students have enrolled at the University, including 39,101 UG students, 3,978 PG students, and 612 research scholars. The administrative sections of our University are functioning efficiently. The teaching faculties are actively involved in teaching and research per their specializations. We have 66 H-index and total citations are 21671 which shows that we are being recognized as one of the important research institutes. Our faculty have received various grants and fellowships from both the state and central governments. In fact, 15 MoUs and 05 research collaborations with eminent Universities and Research organizations prove the above mentioned fact. Many department faculty and students have enrolled for SWAYAM and NPTEL courses and have successfully completed them. The University has recently established USEC, IPR Cell, Food Processing Centre, Materials Development and Skill Development Centers. Many patents have been given to IPR Cell, which boosts our research activities.

Our University was established in 2009, but has a history of 45 years. In 1979, it was a PG Centre of the University of Mysore, and from 1987, it was under the Kuvempu University. Since

2009, it has been functioning as an independent University.

I am greatly indebted to Paramapoojya shri shri shri 1108 Shivamurthy shivacharya swamiji of Sirigere, Taralabalu Bruhanmutt and Hon'ble former chief minister Shri B S Yediyurappa Ji for helping in the establishment of our University. I extend heartfelt thanks to our land donors to establish then P.G. Centre viz., Hon'ble Secretary of Bapuji Educational Association and former minister Dr. Shamanur Shivashankarappa ji and Rajanally Maddurayappa Laxmanashetty Trust for donating 48 acres and 24 acres respectively. As a result, this center has now grown-up as an independent University. My thanks to the Government of Karnataka, Hon'ble Chief Minister of Karnataka, Sri Siddaramaiah ji, the Higher Education Minister Dr. M C Sudhakar ji, Smt. - Efforts were made by all the faculty members of the department towards further strengthening of the mentor and mentee system.
- Faculty members of the various department made 15 MoUs and 05 collaborations.
- The faculty members of the department published 548 research papers in various leading journals/edited volumes/conference proceedings, 57 Ph.D. degrees awarded and 2 patents registered. 5 awards were received by the faculty members towards their research output.

- A Total of 12 projects were sanctioned with a grant of 110 lakhs from Government and Non-Government agencies.

- Around 90 inter-disciplinary courses were promoted in PG programs at the University.
- University, with the help of RUSA fund developed high end instruments facility.
- All the PG departments of the University promoted SWAYAM/MOOCs/NPTEL courses among the students. Around 715 students enrolled for the above said programs.
- A total of 17 value added courses were offered in the PG Departments.
- English language lab facilities are provided for all the students of PG Departments.
- Regular coaching classes are conducted for the students towards KSET, NET, JRF and other exams.
- A total of 34 research methodology programs/Skill Development programs were conducted.

- Integration of research components into undergraduate and postgraduate programs to foster a research-oriented academic environment.

- SEP based curriculum has been adopted UG programs for the year 2024-25.
- PG curriculum was revised during the academic year 2024-25 to align with encouraging academic and industrial trends.
- Provided special laboratory facilities for PG science departments.
- Faculty members were encouraged to visit premier institutions such as IISc., IIMB., foreign Universities etc., as visiting scientists.
- Green campus initiatives were undertaken to promote environmental sustainability for improve Biodiversity and Ecological balance.
- Developed a mini – forest in the campus.
- Rain water harvesting and borewell recharge systems were initiated to promote water conservation on campus.

SC/ST Cell

- Prasaraṅga is much focused on publishing Kannada books/theses/monographs.

4. Organization and Administration:

a. Procedures to address Intra and inter campus administration:

- The Vice-Chancellor is the Head of the Institution; He is assisted by the Registrar (Administration), Registrar (Evaluation), Finance officer and the Deans of all the Faculties in academic and administrative matters.
- As the Chairperson of the Syndicate and the Academic Council, the Vice-Chancellor ensures the smooth functioning of the University in the development and implementation of policies framed.
- At the department level, the Chairperson/Coordinator plays a leadership role in academic and administrative matters.
- The University provides necessary support and encouragement to its affiliated colleges to become autonomous. The University has made statutes in this regard.
- The University always encourages the participation of all stakeholders by creating a conducive, participatory intellectual ambience. All academic decisions are taken after deliberation at the department, faculty, and university levels, providing opportunities for younger members to articulate their viewpoints.
- In addition, teachers are nominated to important Committees, to hold administrative positions (as Registrar, Registrar (Evaluation), Finance officer and Development sectors). This grooms strong leadership.

All the vacancies in administrative/technical/support which are approved by the Government are filled.

- Outsourcing has been used to acquire the necessary manpower and ex-servicemen for campus security on both the main and other campuses.

- All campuses and buildings are under CCTV surveillance for unwavering security; supervisors patrol the campus hourly.

- Organising appropriate training modules for the existing staff to record and maintain Universities database for their routine work.
- Creation of a directory of scientists/noted educationalists and scientific institutions for the interaction of the faculty members and scholars.
- Liaisoning with funding agencies/Departments/Teachers/Scholars to promote collaborative and interdisciplinary academic endeavours.

- Assisting the Vice-Chancellor and the administration in planning, programming and implementation of various developmental activities with adequate facts and figures.
- The PMEB is conducting research ethics and research methodology for PhD students every year.
- The PMEB is also conducting FDP programme for university faculty members.

11. Admission Procedures:

- Admission will be given to all eligible candidates for the available programs within intake as per regulations.
- For PG programs, there is a centralized system of admission through counseling. Admission processes will be made through the Admission Committee of the faculty of the concerned department. Admissions will be made as per the existing rules and regulations.

b. Strategies to increase GER

- Various awareness programmes are being conducted in UG colleges to appraise potential students to the programs available under different faculties, opportunities for employment and research, and the admission procedure.
- The students are given the provision to pay open merit fees on an instalment basis and are counselled on loan facilities available.

Davangere University regards it as a privilege to assist the community's Divyang/ differently abled people. We have a policy in place to ensure that the campus is accessible to those with disabilities, and every attempt has been made to ensure that the Divyangjan have a barrier-free

environment to learn in.

CONCESSIONS FOR DIVYANGJAN:

- According to an order issued by the Government of Karnataka, the University would waive the tuition cost and the special charge for students with impairments.
- Additional salary is provided to Divyang Faculty members as per Government orders.
- A free ship is often given as an Institutional scholarship to encourage students with impairments to pursue higher education.
- Higher education especially to pursue Ph.D. for the visually impaired, provided in addition to a conventional system.

SERVICES FOR DIVYANGJAN:

The Centre is comprised of an Enabling Unit, a Barrier-Free Centre, adapted material Production units, an adapted library, Training Courses, Awareness - raising Programs, and Academic Programs designed specifically for the differently abled. The University is initiating and successfully executing various schemes of the University Grants Commission (UGC) and the Government of Karnataka for the welfare of the differently abled.

Every year, a special committee comprised of an expert from the area, a faculty member from the Department of Human Development, the University Counsellor, and the coordinator of the Family and Child Enrichment Centre reviews the concessions and makes any necessary changes. Apart from that, children with learning impairments have the option to confer with the team, as well as their parents, to choose the discipline that is most suited to their ability.

The procedure is as follows:

- A meeting with his/her parents and peers is being planned to ascertain potential interests during counselling.
- Suggestions for appropriate discipline are given.
- If the student wants, he/she may seek a modification in discipline in following the recommendation.
- Students and their parents are educated about the concessions.

- Additionally, if necessary, the committee can offer a particular list of concessions for a student.

SENSITISATION PROGRAMS:

The University organises public and student awareness-raising activities such as Rallies, Human Chains, Walkathons, Signature Campaigns, and Awareness Brochures on the themes of disability prevention, disability rights, inclusion and human rights for people with disabilities through the Coordinator, Divyang cell, Davangere University.

Disability inclusive pedagogy, and technology that help students with disabilities are being brought to the attention of faculty and higher education. Librarians and volunteers are being educated on their roles in creating a more inclusive society alongside students from different fields.

THE INFRASTRUCTURE AND THE PHYSICAL SUPPORT:

- All classrooms have wooden study chairs with writing pads attached.

RESTROOMS:

- Students (students who are / physically handicapped / for medical reasons) have access to the western toilet and special washrooms are constructed at Hostels.

o. Grievance redressal mechanism.

The University has established the “Students Grievance Redressal Cell” under the Directorate of Student Welfare office, to provide a mechanism for the redressal of student grievances and ensure transparency and prevention of unfair practices. A nodal officer has been appointed to monitor and respond to students’ grievances. Students from Davangere University and its affiliated colleges can lodge complaints through the “online students Grievances Redressal Portal” of UGC (website: www.ugc.ac.in/), New Delhi, related to the admission process, non transparent or any unfair evaluation practices, provisions of students amenities, alleged discrimination of students, etc. Very few grievances were received from students and these were readdressed through discussion and counselling.

Grievances from students were redressed by the system as well as by direct representation to the Head of the Department. Separate cells are in

place for student grievances, such as the prevention of sexual harassment of women staff and students. The grievances of faculty and non-teaching staff can be addressed to the heads and also directly to the Vice-Chancellor/Registrar. Adequate measures are taken to redress all grievances. Most of the grievances are redressed through counseling and discussion.

p. Placement cell and campus Recruitment:

The university's Post-Graduate departments have been actively organizing campus interviews to assist students in securing placements for the 2024-25 academic year. The University Placement Training Cell oversees these efforts, providing students with access to a range of job opportunities.

This year, PG students from various departments have achieved successful placements, with an impressive average salary of 3.5 lakhs per annum. Notable companies participating in the recruitment process include Manappuram Finance Limited, Bandhan Bank, EZY ventures tech support, Essvee Recruittech ECA/CC and GRAB A GRUB Services Pvt Ltd.

This initiative not only enhances student employability but also bolsters the university's reputation in the job market.

q. Entrepreneurship/Incubation Cell:

Departments of the University especially the MSW, MBA, Commerce, Economics, Food Technology, Biochemistry and Microbiology, have entrepreneurship training programs. In these programs, students visit various industries for training and are encouraged to establish small scale minor industry plans to be implemented after their program completion.

17. Curricular Design and Development :

i. Language empowerment – Promotion of Kannada:

- Students are competent and proficient in local language Kannada and some of the students have good command over Kannada literature.
- Students are free to write the exam either in Kannada or English in most of the arts departments.
- Promotion of Kannada has been done through teaching- learning process, research activities and counselling for the students.
- Students are permitted to write examination in Kannada for most of the arts departments.
- All the official correspondence from the office of Honorable Vice Chancellor and office of the Registrar are in Kannada.
- All the official correspondence from various departments of the university are in Kannada.
- Translation and comparative studies are a part of our curriculum. Rural Student/Students are also taught in Kannada language along with English language.

ii. Centre for International Language

- English language laboratory has been set in the university campus.
- It's mandatory for all the PG students to get benefit out of this lab with 2 credit course in various semesters under CBCS scheme.
- Currently only English lab has been set up and planning to setup international add-on language courses for all the students in coming days.

iii. New and novel courses introduced with due emphasis on skill development and employability.

- All the PG Departments of the University, identified the courses on skill development and employability and made it as a part of their scheme of teaching and evaluation.

iv. Interdisciplinary courses introduced

Interdisciplinary open-elective courses have been offered for PG students, in which students can opt for any open-elective courses offered by the various PG departments. The students enrolled under open-elective courses will be thought at respective departments of courses offered for 2hrs/week which is 2 credit courses.

Padma Bhushan Prof. Shri. P. Balaram born on February 19, 1949 is a renowned Biochemist and the former Director of the Indian Institute of Science, Bengaluru. He is currently a Chaired Professor at National Centre for Biological Sciences, Bengaluru. He has had an illustrious career because of his strong educational background. He completed his Bachelor's Degree from Fergusson College, University of Pune in 1967; he received Master's Degree from IIT Kanpur in 1969; he was awarded Ph.D. from Carnegie Mellon University, Pittsburg in (1972); and did his Postdoctoral from Harvard University, USA. His research acumen is substantiated by the fact that, he has published more than 400 research articles in reputed journals worldwide. He has also served as the editor

His contributions in the area of biological membranes and in developing fluorescent probe methodology for examining membrane structure are highly significant. In this Convocation, Davanagere University is awarding **59 Ph.D.** Degrees. In addition to that, we are awarding Graduate Degrees to **12,128** candidates and Masters Degrees to **1,919** candidates in the year 2023-24. The average Graduate pass percentage is **61.13%** and average Post-Graduate pass percentage is **96.14%**. Total **45** Students are being awarded with **87** Gold Medals for the year 2023-24. I congratulate all our students and wish the best of everything in their future. I take this opportunity to express my most sincere congratulations to Graduates, Post graduates, Rank Holders, and Ph.Ds. Your accomplishments will help our University to progress in the right direction.

Deserving personalities have been considered for the award of Honorary Doctorate degrees and I congratulate the eminent personalities who are being conferred with the honorary doctorate degrees today.

Academic Programs:

Now it is befitting to present a brief progress report about our University's accomplishments on various fronts. The Educational scenario is bright in Davanagere and Chitradurga Districts. There are many educational institutes which cater to the educational needs of the students. Davanagere University was established on 18th August 2009 with a vision to meet the educational aspirations of the people of these regions. The University is recognized by UGC under 2 (f) and 12 (b). The University has a total area of 255 acres of land spread across five campuses. The ambiance of the campus is lush with greenery; young students and energetic staff are the striking features of the University. Our University has just completed 15 years of its existence and making strides in academic field. The University offers more than 30 P.G Programmes at main campus and 05 Programmes at Jnana Gangotri, Post-Graduate Center at Chitradurga. The University offers Ph.D. Program in 23 Subjects. The University has the pride of having constituent colleges - College of Visual Arts, Government First Grade Colleges at Thuruvanur and Hariyabbe, Chitradurga. We also have **128** affiliated colleges. More than **46,482** students are studying in our University. The regulations of Karnataka Government and Karnataka State University Act-2000 are being followed in terms of reservation for providing social justice to all. In this Academic year 2024 the University has started Master of Computer Applications (MCA) for Post Graduate Students.

I am pleased to reveal that our University's **H-index is 66 and total citations are 21,671**. Our University was assessed by the NAAC in 2022 and obtained B+ Grade. Our faculty members have been recognized by both National and International level research organizations. Our University is adjudged as **Best IP Institute Award** by Government of Karnataka. **42 MoUs** have been signed with National and International Universities including – **Water Bath University, USA and Tarapaca University, Chile**, Davanagere University comes within 51 to 100 ranks among the State Public University Ranking conducted by the National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF). For the first time in the history of Davanagere University, **a Public Private Partnership model has been established in collaboration with Dr. Shamanur Shivashankarappa Health Care Trust and Q-Spiders, Bengaluru to train 1200 UG students for enhancing their Job Skills**. The Syllabi of all the 30 PG Departments have been revised in this Academic year. **The University Library spends 20.00 Lakh Rupees** every year to procure Books and Journals for Faculty, Students and Research Scholars. The Online Digital Library provides access to various National and International Journals. **The University has registered for One Nation one Subscription (ONOS). A MoU with Developing Library Network (DELNET) has been signed.** A One day Training Program for working Librarians on E-Resources was organized.

Recently, our University is recognized as the Best University in Faculty Development Programme by the Karnataka State Higher Education Council, Bengaluru and has been provided Rs.50 Lakh for the overall development of

the University. Three Auditoriums have been renovated under this grant. A State of the art laboratory for Criminology and Forensic Science is being established with 10 lakh rupees. According to the UGC Guidelines, a 7 percent of Internal Resources is earmarked for University research activities. Dr. U.S. Mahabaleshwar, Dr. Prasanna Kumar B.C, and Dr. Prakash D.G from the Department of Mathematics; Prof. Govindappa. M from the Department of Botany have been listed as part of the Top 2% Scientists List published by the Stanford University, USA.

National Education Policy-2020 (NEP-2020):

In order to improve Academic field Central and State Governments have implemented National Education Policy-2020. Davanagere University is one among the first Universities to implement curriculum based on NEP-2020. We've been meticulous in framing academic Programs for the benefit of students' community. We have published Text Books for Kannada and English NEP syllabi through our Publication wing Prasaranga.

State Education Policy-2024 (SEP-2024):

The Government of Karnataka has introduced the State Education Policy (SEP-2024), to facilitate Higher Education in the State to cater to the demands of Students in their educational field and their careers. The Davanagere University has implemented this policy and also published textbooks regarding the English and Kannada Syllabi through our publication unit Prasaranga. Eight Textbooks are being prepared in this academic year.

Research and Development Cell:

Based on University Grants Commission (UGC) guidelines, Davanagere University has established R&D Cell in order to encourage Research and also establish collaborative Research programs with reputed Institutions. Currently 508 Research Students are pursuing their Research in 23 Subjects for Ph.D.

All the faculty members are involved actively in research. More than **Rs. 5 Crores** worth extra-mural funds are generated from funding agencies such as ICMR, DST, DBT, BRNS, UGC, K-VGST etc. Around 975 research papers have been published.

Planning, Monitoring and Evaluation Board (PMEB):

For the overall development of University Planning, Monitoring and Evaluation Board has been constituted. This board strives to organize funds from UGC, National funding Agencies and also Government of Karnataka. It has organized Two Days FDP for Faculties and organized National Science Day in the campus. During Teachers Day Celebration University has Awarded 06 Teachers with best Teachers Publications Award. More than Forty Teachers are applied for funding assistance from various funding agencies during the last one year.

Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC):

University performance, related to the educational processes and outcomes,

covering the curriculum, teaching-learning, evaluation, faculty, research, infrastructure, learning resources, organization, governance, financial well-being and student services are being monitored by IQAC. It is actively engaged in conducting various academic programs. The University has conducted Two Academic and Administrative Audit (AAA) Committee visits from 2023 to 2025 and has immensely benefited from the feedback in improvement.

Academic Writing Development Cell:

As per the directions from Government of Karnataka, Academic, Writing Development Cell has been formed. This Cell aims at providing opportunity for Faculty, Research Scholars and Students to improve Academic writing through various seminars and workshops.

Infrastructure and Amenities:

The University has provided certain modern facilities to students like labs, ICT enabled classrooms etc., and the campus has got free Internet services. Student-friendly academic environment has been created. We have a dedicated State of the Language lab in our University. A museum was established for the Department of Studies in Zoology in this academic year. The University has renovated 3 auditoriums with modern facilities under the 50 lakh rupees grant sanctioned for The Best FDP University from the Government of Karnataka. The Visual Arts College of Davanagere University is celebrating its Diamond Jubilee this year in a befitting manner by establishing a state of the art Theme Park and an Open Air Theatre in its premises by the Smart City Project of Davanagere.

Library:

The **University Library** is housed in new and beautiful building, “**Jnana Soudha**” (**Knowledge Resource Centre**) and is well equipped with **51,929** reference and text books, 176 Science and Social Science e-books, 40 journals on current subjects, **2,150** back volumes of periodicals, and good number of Government and Institution reports. Library provides services like internet and E-Journals facilities to students, research scholars and teachers. The library is getting e-journals under UGC-INFONET program. Additionally, the library provides **3393** books for SC/ST students and **905** books for OBC students. Recently Digital Library with **KOHA Software** and **Drill Bit** for checking plagiarism have been installed.

University Science Instrumentation Center (USIC):

The University Scientific Instrumentation Centre (USIC), Davanagere University was established on the University premises in 2021 with the support of Rashtriya Uchchatar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA). The main objective of the USIC is to provide the in-house facilities, such as analytical instrument facility to support advanced research in thrust areas; to provide facilities of sophisticated analytical instruments to academicians from academic institutes, Research & Development laboratories and Industries - to enable them to carry out collaborative R and D work. The USIC also conducts workshop and training

Programmes on the use and applications of various scientific Instruments for research scholars and students of Davanagere University and affiliated colleges. An exclusive Building for USIC is under construction.

Study Centers:

Our University has established Dr. Babu Jagjeevan Ram Study Center and Shri Sarvajna Peetha in the year 2011; and Dr. M. Chidananda Murthy Kannada Study Centre funded by Government of Karnataka. These Centers are dedicated to studying contemporary issues. Dr. Babu Jagjeevan Ram Study Center has published 05 Books, and The Sarvajna Peetha has published more than 28 Books and conducted various competitions for students. Jayaratna Kalyana Kendra Trust, Davanagere has instituted award and endowment lectures in social sciences.

Training and Placement Cell:

The University has established Training and Campus Placement Cell to provide opportunity for students to get jobs in various industries.

Social Justice:

The University takes due care of the students belonging to the categories through its SC/ST and OBC cells. Ph.D. - fellowships and other scholarships are also provided to the students. Special training is provided to the students belonging to SC/ST/OBC categories in order to nurture their potential and help them in getting jobs. Coaching classes are conducted to prepare them for administrative examinations. The students belonging to SC/ST and OBC are provided with additional books for their reference.

Social Commitment:

University has adopted 10 villages from both the districts for academic and social development. In this regard, the survey has been completed and work plan for over all development is being prepared. Simultaneously, Ten Government Schools will be identified for up-gradation by the University. This year, a grant of 50,000 Rupees has been released to the Department of MBA under the Unnat Bharat Abhiyan Scheme to adopt 05 villages by the Ministry of Education, Government of India.

Prasaranga:

The University established Prasaranga in 2023 year for the scholarly publications. Since its inception - *Prasaranga* is actively engaged in publishing books in different disciplines of arts, science, drama, criticism, and management. More than 101 books are getting ready to be published by Prasaranga. Our University has signed a MoU with Kannada University, Hampi for quality/technical publications.

NSS Activities:

Students are encouraged to actively participate in **NSS activities**. Village adoption, campus cleaning, awareness creation, maintaining green campus are

the salient features of the NSS unit in the University. Dr. Ashok V. Paled, N.S.S. Program Coordinator of Davanagere University has been appreciated by the Ministry of Youths Affairs and Sports, Govt. of India and Regional Directorate of N.S.S, Bengaluru for his dedication on arranging for Student-Police Experiential Learning Program under MY Bharat Portal Widely covering Davanagere and Chitradurga Districts and completing the task assigned by the Police Department.

Post Graduate GYMKHANA:

In order to encourage students in extra-curricular activities, cultural events and sports University Gymkhana has been formed. Under this association, inter-collegiate, inter-zone and Post-Graduation level competitions were organized and youth festival program was conducted. Several students were given with certificates and prizes.

Sports Activities:

Various sports events are being organized in the University and Affiliated Colleges. University selection for inter-collegiate and inter-University competitions are being held every year.

Biodiversity Documentation:

Our University campus is famously considered as the *Green and Clean* campus. Containing more than 7000 trees the campus provides ambient conditions for not only academic work but also bio-diversity. The campus is documented to contain 72 bird species and 38 butterflies along with other flora and fauna.

CONVOCATION ADDRESS

Good Afternoon to everyone. The Honourable Chancellor and Governor of Karnataka, Shri Thaawarchand Gehlot Ji, the Hon'ble Higher Education Minister and Pro-Chancellor Dr. M.C. Sudhakar Ji, the Vice-Chancellor Professor B.D. Kumbar Ji, Registrar's, the Syndicate and Academic Council members, Recipients of Degree Honoris Causa, the Principal's and Director's from various colleges, Teaching Faculty, Non-Teaching Staff, Distinguished Guests, Invitees and most importantly, the Graduating Students of this Convocation. Ladies and Gentlemen.

It is a privilege for me to deliver this address on a very important day for the University. The great progress the country has made since Independence in the sphere of higher technical education has largely, if not entirely, been the result of public initiatives. It is only in more recent times that private institutions have begun to cater to the huge demand for higher education in our country. Yours is a very young institution occupying a key position in the development of higher education in the State of Karnataka. I spent all my active professional years in one of India's oldest institutions, the Indian Institute of Science,

Bengaluru, which is now nearly 116 years old, a period which has seen the most dramatic transformations in science, technology and global affairs in all human history. Looking back at the 20th century, those of us who have lived through the second half could scarcely have imagined how the world would change in our lifetime.

When invited by Professor Kumbar to join all of you on this important day, I wondered what I should say? I have been a scientist all my professional life, cloistered in the laboratories of the Indian Institute of Science. I still spend my time amongst scientists at the National Centre for Biological Sciences and teach whenever I can. To speak at a Convocation is a difficult task, especially as I alone stand between you and the celebration that will inevitably follow the completion of this formal ceremony. Every one of you who graduates today deserves to celebrate the award of the degrees that you so richly merit.

Most of you may not have opted to study science. Yet I stand before you as a scientist. I will venture to make some remarks on science and natural history, at a time when memories of the Covid-19 pandemic, remain fresh in our memory. For over two years between 2020 and 2022 a biological organism, a virus, brought the world to its knees. Both politics and religion, two of the dominating influences in all human societies, bowed before a force of nature. It is customary in Convocations nowadays to talk about the state of Higher Education in India or the impact of the New Education Policy. These are favorite subjects of educationists and politicians. Highly divergent views are supported by dubious facts and deeply held prejudices. I shall avoid these subjects and focus instead on a subject I think about.

Why is science important? Remember it is the scientific advances of the last two centuries that have driven the modern technological revolution. I am also aware, as you undoubtedly are, that the last four years have seen an upsurge in public awareness of science, driven by the coronavirus and the Covid-19 pandemic. RT-PCR, rapid antigen tests, aerosol transmission, mRNA vaccines and mathematical modelling are terms that are now commonly used in discussions between those unaware of the language of science

Over fifty-seven years ago, when I graduated from Fergusson College in Pune and went out into the world with a BSc degree, it was indeed a different world. Thirty-eight years ago, when I reached the high point of any academic career, admission to the professorial rank, the world around me was still largely as it was in the late 1960s. But, in this interregnum, unknown to me, major revolutions were underway in science and technology. These upheavals spanned a range of disciplines, genome sequencing and genetic engineering in biology, the explosion of computer technologies and the communications revolution. Even as I speak the revolution in Artificial Intelligence, spurred by advances in computer science, promise to transform our lives. My generation can only marvel at the way the internet, Google and the cell phone forever transformed the way we live.

Social media can influence not only the fate of individuals but also nations. These technological advances rested on fundamental breakthroughs in physics, chemistry, biology, materials science, mathematics, and computer science, often the result of decades of painstaking research. Rarely were they the result of that blinding flash of insight that often makes science look glamorous and romantic from the outside. Think of gene sequencing technologies, reflect on the lithium battery, so central to our lives today, or the electronic processors that drive all our devices and many more and you will realize science and technology are inseparable.

I have sometimes been asked a question: “What is Science”. I have responded that Science is the study of Nature. That leads to another question: What is Nature? The best answer that I found was in the editorial in the very first volume of the journal *Nature*, that appeared in 1869. The famous biologist Thomas Huxley was invited to write the editorial, heralding the appearance of a new science journal. Huxley did not write the editorial. Instead, he translated an essay in German, written in the mid-18th century, by the poet von Goethe. In the poet’s words: “*Nature! We are surrounded and embraced by her: powerless to penetrate beyond her and powerless to separate ourselves from her.*”

Think of the subjects you have studied in school. Physics and Biology are with you all the time, even though you may not choose to recognize this fact. Nothing in the world around you (including yourselves) is divorced from chemistry. Of mathematics, I can do no better than remind you that Galileo is reported to have once remarked, that “mathematics is the language in which God wrote the Universe”. Paraphrasing Galileo, I might add, Chemistry is the language in which Nature wrote the Book of Life. The biochemist Arthur Kornberg aptly described chemistry as the “*lingua franca of the biological and medical sciences*”

Science requires tools and sometimes we underestimate the role of technology in driving science. The theoretical physicist Freeman Dyson once noted that “*Science is often driven by new technologies rather than new concepts*”. In the 17th century two inventions, the telescope and the microscope, forever altered our view of the world. When the Italian, Galileo, pointed the telescope skywards, he opened the field of cosmology, until then restricted by human vision. Today when we celebrate the Chandrayan mission remember all that has gone before and imagine all that might follow. When the Dutchman, Leeuwenhoek, examined water under his microscope, he discovered living organisms too small to be seen with the naked eye. He had uncovered the vast science of microbiology, a field which has really impacted public consciousness during the years of the pandemic. In the 20th century, separated by a span of seven decades, two discoveries revolutionized medicine, making diagnostic radiology indispensable for clinical practice. Both came from physics. The first was Roentgen’s discovery of X-rays at the dawn of the century, the second Lauterbur’s imaging of two concentric tubes of water, in the 1970s, using nuclear

magnetic resonance in inhomogeneous magnetic fields. This was the birth of magnetic resonance imaging (MRI). Can there be better examples to argue the case for basic science? Interdisciplinary science, engineering and manufacturing were the key elements in ensuring that the fruits of fundamental physics reached the clinic. Generations of patients have benefitted from these techniques.

Much of modern technology, that all of us take for granted, is the product of two centuries of scientific advance in physics, chemistry and biology. Remember that the basic sciences, often neglected in our institutions, form the foundations for technological progress. We all know instinctively what light is. But it required Michael Faraday and James Maxwell to establish the connections between electricity, magnetism and light. Today, auctioning the electromagnetic spectrum can be a highly lucrative endeavour. Look with wonder at Mendeleev's Periodic Table, the very same topic that NCERT threatens to remove from the 10th class syllabus. Remember the element silicon is as critical to modern information technology as the element carbon is to life. Think of what distinguishes human intelligence from the looming spectre of artificial intelligence. The famous neurologist and writer Oliver Sacks called it the "*enchanted garden of Mendeleev*". Willard Gibbs in isolation brought Thermodynamics into being, a subject that forms the foundation of the sciences. Ludwig Boltzmann thought of heat and the atom, the origins of our ideas of entropy, which are to be seen even in Claude Shannon's now immortal work, which laid the foundation for information science and technology. Oswald Avery in 1943 discovered DNA as the material substance responsible for the transfer of genetic information in biology. The Watson -Crick double helix provided the missing link between the 19th century pillars of biology, Mendelian genetics and Darwinian evolution. DNA is a term that even politicians use in public speeches; a tribute to an acronym that is pregnant with meaning. I could go on and on, but on a day when you celebrate your education, I can only say that there is much to learn.

But those amongst us who ceaselessly marvel at the wonders of Nature, have asked the question: Where did everything we see around us come from? This leads to questions which cannot always be answered, questions on the origins of the Universe, questions on the origins of life on earth. All the natural elements in Mendeleev's Periodic Table were the Earth's inheritance when it was born. Nucleosynthesis is the prerogative of the stars, our sun amongst them. In his magisterial survey of the *Ascent of Man* Jacob Bronowski describes the formation of carbon so essential for life and I quote: "... *in all the stars there are going on processes which build up the atoms one by one into more complex structures. Matter itself evolves. The word comes from Darwin and biology, but it is the word that changed physics in my lifetime.*" Bronowski goes on to reflect on the formation of carbon, so essential for life. "*The formation of carbon atoms happens when three helium nuclei collide for one millionth of a millionth of a second. Every carbon atom in every living creature is the result of such a wildly improbable collision*". Life and biology are indeed improbable, a chance event in our solar

system's evolutionary history. To quote Jacques Monod: "The universe was not pregnant with life nor the biosphere with man. Our number came up in the Monte Carlo game."

After centuries of science can one list its most important achievements? But here I must quote, the always eminently quotable physicist, Richard Feynman. In his introductory lecture, in his now immortal course on undergraduate physics at Caltech, he asks: "*If, in some cataclysm, all of scientific knowledge were to be destroyed, and only one sentence passed on to the next generations of creatures, what statement would contain the most information in the fewest words?*" He answers: "*I believe it is the atomic hypothesis (or the atomic fact, or whatever you wish to call it) that all things are made of atoms—little particles that move around in perpetual motion, attracting each other when they are a little distance apart, but repelling upon being squeezed into one another*". Ironically, the cataclysm that must have occupied Feynman's thoughts in the 1950s and 1960s would have been the threat of nuclear war. Sadly, that prospect appears to have once again emerged, as conflicts rage unabated in the Middle East and Eastern Europe and an uneasy calm prevails along other contentious national borders. In the world of geopolitics there is little time to wonder about the fragile thread by which life on Earth hangs and the importance of preserving the natural world (which of course includes the human species) even as unsustainable consumption and development threatens the natural order. No subject is more relevant to the state of Uttarakhand than sustainability science, which focusses on environmental conservation and mitigation of hazards, often a consequence of unscientific development.

Human history is often taught as a succession of centuries of unrelenting human conflict, with every new age introducing ever more powerful technologies of war; all of them products of an ever-improving understanding of the material world. Science and technology, based on this very same understanding, have driven the course of human history, shaping cultures and civilisations. The 20th century began with Planck and the quantum, catalysing a frenetic pace of advance in physics and chemistry over much of the decades that followed. The revolution in biology began in the mid-1950s, quietly at first when the structure of the gene was revealed, but grew into an unstoppable flood of information, culminating in the first human genome sequence, announced as the 21st century was born. Today DNA sequences from fossils, ancient DNA, are being used to trace the origins of the human species and the migrations of our ancestors across the Earth. This early human history, pre-history, requires the confluence of many disciplines, archaeology, palaeontology, molecular biology and computer science amongst them. The methods of genomics allow us to go even further back in time, as we ask questions about the evolution of life on Earth. I leave you with just a thought that the formation of our universe, our sun, our solar system and our planet must have come first. In the over 4.5 billion years of the Earth's existence human beings, as we might recognise them, have lived only for about 100 thousand years. Many questions, about chemical evolution, the evolution of

single cells, archaea and bacteria, the birth of eukaryotic cells and the oxygenation of the atmosphere after the evolution of photosynthesis about 2 billion years ago, must precede the birth of the first animal life on our planet. We have come a long way since then.

In his book *Sapiens* the Israeli historian Yuval Harari traces the evolution of humankind. He asks an interesting question which I paraphrase: When in the course of human evolution does human behaviour begin to disregard the biological imperatives, survival and reproduction, that dominate animal behaviour, and become increasingly influenced by recent history. In Harari's words: *"The cognitive revolution is accordingly the point when history declared its independence from biology. The immense diversity of imagined realities that Sapiens invented and the resulting diversity of behaviour patterns are the main components of what we call 'cultures'. Once cultures appeared they never ceased to change and develop, and these unstoppable alterations are what we call 'history'. From the Cognitive Revolution onwards historical narratives replace biological theories as our primary means of explaining the development of Homo Sapiens. To understand the rise of Christianity or the French Revolution it is not enough to comprehend the interaction of genes, hormones and organisms. It is necessary to take into account the interaction of ideas, images and fantasies as well"*.

In an age dominated by mythology we would do well to remember that comparative genomics tells us that human beings are a minor branch in the Tree of Life, budding from the broader branch of *eukarya*. Life on earth is dominated by the microbial branches, *bacteria* and *archaea*. Our closest neighbours are chimpanzees, rats, mice, pigs, horses, cattle, sheep, and dogs. There is a certain comforting unity in biology. Yet human history, driven by civilizational influences and the evolution of culture, appears to be sadly divisive. The coronavirus has breached all political, religious and ethnic boundaries, reminding us that politics and religion, two favourite pastimes, worldwide, afford no protection against a force of Nature. Remember that arrogance, most often a quality possessed in abundance by the very rich and the very powerful, is no defense against a force of Nature.

Why do I draw your attention to such a disparate group of subjects? It is because of the environment, climatic, social, and political, in which we live today. Some reflection on the roles of science in understanding Nature may allow us to introspect on the course of human history and attempt to rationalise why the world today is the way it is. Science is a deeply humbling subject and every day we are reminded of our imperfect understanding of even the subjects of our daily research. It is this humility that is important in any sphere of human activity. Learning is a continuous and never-ending process.

There are two qualities that will stand you in good stead in whatever you wish to do, resilience and imagination. In research, and indeed in many other

walks of life, failure is more common than success. Overcoming the fear of failure is often the first step towards success. Let your imagination take you forward. It has been a privilege to address you and may I wish all of you the very best in the years to come.

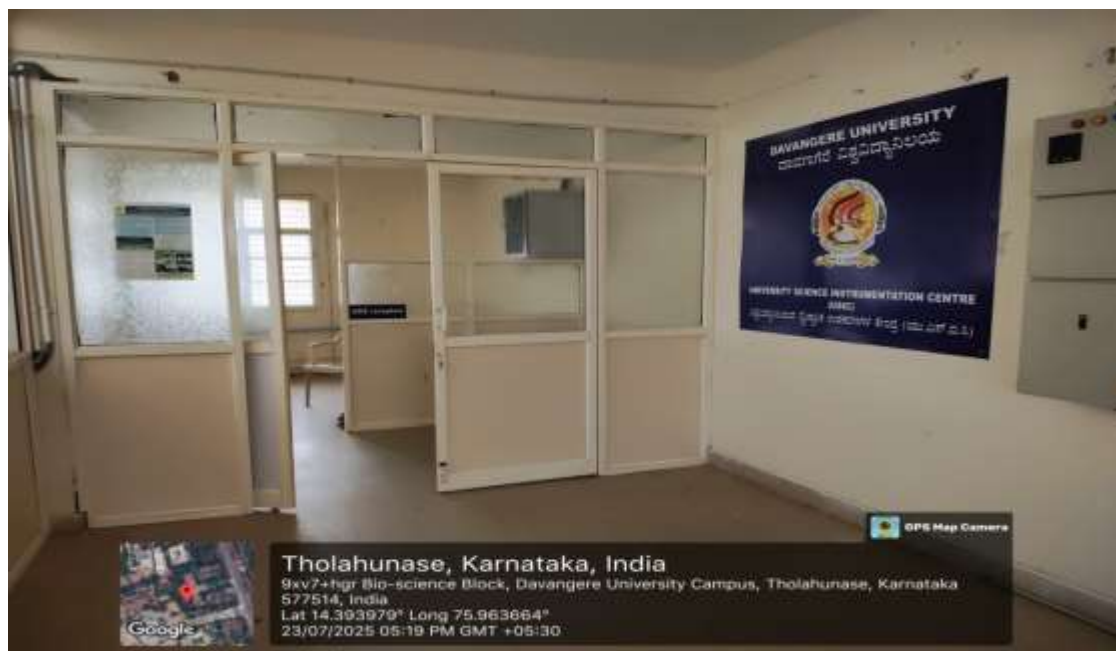

1.Title of the Practice: Promotion of Research Activities

2. Objectives of the Practice:

The main objectives of the proposed practice is to develop a multi-dimensional research culture at the university to meet the proposed vision and mission through advance and translational research outputs. The state-of-the-art facilities created for research integrating interdisciplinary approach to maximize the utility and promoting innovative ideas into practical applications. The practices were structured to give flexibility for inter-university, institution and industry through Linkages, MoUs and Collaborations to accomplish the desired research outputs of social relevance in terms of publications and patents.

The core objectives constitute:

1. To improve and set up a good research culture, innovations in core research areas in the campus.
2. To encourage faculty and researchers to undertake advanced and translational projects, mobilize funds and obtain patents.
3. To develop and improve national and international collaborations
4. To improve National and International collaborations.

3. The Context:

Research plays an important role in the growth and overall development of all Higher Education Institutions. The University is committed to fulfil its vision and mission to provide excellent research facilities by enabling the research students to complete their dream projects. All the necessary assistance is provided to the students to overcome the difficulties while doing research by providing **centralized science instrumentation** facilities and **digital access to e-journals**. The University has supported research students by providing **fellowships, seed money** for innovative research ideas and creating research lab spaces and centre of excellence. Moreover, the University has designed a policy to facilitate National and International Collaborations to establish an effective research implementation of National and Global reputation. It recognizes and honours research output from the university to draw attention from an aspiring industries and institutions for Collaborative funding and provides opportunity for aspiring research students to pursue their research ambitions.

4. The Practice:

To establish a professional environment in research along with teaching, the following practices have been implemented:

1. Faculty members are encouraged to submit their research articles to peer reviewed journals having good impact factor, citation index, database index

and others. Research papers published are collected and accessed via IQAC each academic year through Self-Assessment Reports (SAR) submitted by the faculty members. Based on this, best research publications among each faculty will be identified.

2. 4. Collaborative research works between the University teachers and researchers outside the institutions having high reputation are encouraged to improve the quality of research, optimize the research output, research impact, research network and embrace the new challenges towards research.
5. The geographical location of the university deprives and restricts the accessibility of students and faculty members to high quality research facilities. The creation of state-of-the-art research facility at the university provides regional advantage in facilitating research outcomes at the campus and excel with national reputation. All these activities are being conducted to bring out the hidden talent of budding researchers of this region.

5. Evidence of Success:

1. Based on the criteria laid down by the IQAC, the best research publications of the faculties are identified and published in the University publication unit, **Prasaranga** and as a token of **appreciation, certificates** are issued to the concerned Research scholars.
2. During the **last five years, more than 100 project proposals are submitted** to various funding agencies, like UGC New Delhi, DST-SERB, CSIR, DBT, ISSER, VGST Government of Karnataka etc. Research projects have been sanctioned from various funding agencies to several faculty members, both individually and also collaboratively. Further, to explore the innovative abilities of young teachers to develop prototypes, models and also to encourage them to involve in research related activities to the need of the society, University has sanctioned seed money in the name of DUSMYTR (Davangere University Seed Money to Young Teachers for Research) Project. **Forty-eight faculty members** have been recognized and availed seed money to carry out their research activities.
3. Research Collaborations and Linkages have been established to venture research prospective with Universities, institutions and industries in India and abroad through MoU's, the same has been reflected through collaborative research publications representing the contributing institutions.

6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required:

The University has recently recruited a good number of skilled faculty members for the vacant posts for most of the disciplines. In order to inculcate research bent of mind, the director office of the research has conducted many orientations and workshops on research methodology to create awareness about the code of conduct of research, publication ethics and plagiarism. The university had a lack of research laboratory space and equipment management for fresh recruits and steps have been taken to accommodate the research through inter laboratory and

inter disciplinary collaborations. The university had a deficiency in research collaborations with reputed organizations. The research aspiring new recruits have ventured new opportunities to establish MoU's and Linkages with institutes and Universities of high global repute. Earlier, there was a limitation in accessing e- resources to facilitate competitive research, which was addressed by establishing digital library which helps in accessing available e-resources through Inflibnet. In the recent past subdued response from various funding agencies has hindered the research projects. However, several discussions have been made to overcome these hurdles to promote research culture in the campus.

7. Notes:

A good number of quality research publications have been published in a globally recognized Scopus indexed journals with an impact factor ranging from 1 to 14 as research outcomes. The quality of the research output has been reflected in terms of National and International patents.

Best Practice No. : 2

1. Title of the Practice: Students' Mentoring System

2. Objective of the Practice

- To enhance students' self-esteem and academic performance by boosting their confidence and expanding their knowledge base.
- Providing assistance in determining the appropriate educational enrichment programme to build their career.
- Counselling to mentee's during Covid-19 Pandemic to provide moral support.

3. The Context

Mentor-mentee relationships are established with the goal of bridging the gap that exists between instructors and students and supporting students in both scholastic and personal issues. During the Covid-19 epidemic period,

mentoring has shown to be a successful and popular method for giving much needed moral support, advice and assistance to students and their family. The effectiveness of mentoring also contributes to the achievement of programme objectives, which ensures continuity and stability throughout the time. Davangere University's mentor-mentee program's primary goal is to help students reach their full potential in both academics and the workplace by optimizing the abilities of each individual.

4. The Practice

Mentor-mentee Scheme is implemented in each department on the University campus, where a group of 15-18 students (depending on the department's demand ratio) are allotted by the Chairman to each faculty member within their department in the Department Council meet. They serve as mentors to the allotted students in the duration of the course. Mentors plan weekly sessions with these small group throughout the first two weeks of semester. Mentor exposes novice students to university support systems, language, and academic standards and facilities available . This allows new students to embrace the challenges and opportunities that university offers, while making them aware of their responsibilities. Mentors will gather basic information such as medical conditions, native language, permanent address, educational information of the families, assistance in temporary housing, etc. Each mentor meets the mentees at least once a month. During these meets students may discuss academic and personal problems with their mentors. Additionally, the mentor counsels and advises the students on personal and academic matters. Mentors are also accessible through text, email, and mobile phone. The mentor will record each meeting on the Mentor Log Sheet and would take corrective/remedial measures in response to their mentees' issues by interacting with the local guardians of the students or by mentioning them in their subsequent monthly reports.

5. Evidence of Success

When the two-year journey of mentoring is nearing completion, a mentor's

responsibility is to guarantee that his or her mentee has developed into a self-sufficient and self-managed individual and a socially responsible citizen. The student mentoring system that has been implemented at the institution is designed to assist students in their overall growth, including their academic achievement, career development, moving along the proper path, and remaining focused in relevant aspects. During Covid-19 pandemic, mentors were regularly monitoring their mentees about the status of their health, studies and other issues by giving more emphasis regarding their mental status. The same report has been submitted to the Registrar through the Chairman of the concerned departments.

6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required

When it comes to mentoring, it is important to have dedicated teaching assistants (assistance) that strive/s to assist students beyond the traditional classroom. All these mentors have been briefed on several occasions and trained to handle the issues. The main task of mentors is to help the wards to express their problems and find a suitable approach to solve the same.
