GUIDELINES FOR FULL PAPER SUBMISSIONS

- Full paper should **NOT** be more than 3000 to 5000 words with headings such as introduction, methodology, results, discussion and conclusion.
- Maximum of two tables and one figure can be appended separately.
- Referencing style: **APA 6th Edition**
- Declaration by author regarding conflict of interest and ethical clearance are must.

- Paper must contain title of paper, name, designation and institutional affiliation of author or authors, contact details (Email id & Contact address) of the presenting author.
- **Times New Roman style, font size 12, 1.5 spacing in a single file in MS Word format.**

How to reach Davangere University



Davangere University is located on the Shivagangotri campus in Tolahunse, roughly 10 kms from Davangere City, Karnataka, India. The campus lies off NH-4 (Pune-Bangalore highway) on SH-76, easily accessible by road and near the Tholahunse railway station.

By Air:

Fly to Shivamogga (RQY) or Hubballi (HBX) for the shortest drive 140 -150 km, or use Bengaluru (BLR) for the best flight connectivity followed by a 5-hour journey to Davangere.

By Bus:

For a direct road journey, Davangere University is located on National Highway 48 (NH48), approximately 260 km from Bengaluru and 150 km from Hubballi. Once you reach Davangere city, the Shivagangotri campus is situated about 10 km away on the Tolahunase road, easily accessible via taxi or local bus.

By Train:

For a direct rail journey, board any major express train to Davangere (DVG), which is a key station well-connected to Bengaluru (BLR), Hubballi (UBL), and Mumbai. From the Davangere railway station, Shivagangotri campus is just 10 km away and can be reached in 20 minutes by hiring auto-rickshaw or by taking the local buses
